a. Asked the Director if he had had an opportunity to raise with Admiral Radford the proposed visit of [redacted]. The Director said he had done this and it was Radford's feeling that the invitation should come from Admiral Fechteler, CINCPAC.

c. Reported that [redacted] had approached him and asked if there would be any objection to his requesting affidavits from CIA officers who are well-known to him. (25 are involved.) Mr. Helms said he had advised [redacted] to send all of these letters to him and they have now been received. After some discussion it was agreed that Mr. Helms will discuss this matter with Mr. [redacted] and furnish recommendations to the Director as to whether it would be best to have all of these people write in Mr. [redacted]'s behalf or whether the best interests of the Agency would be served in furnishing him one letter from the CIA as a whole.
