Col. White:

Reported it was necessary, in view of the Government-wide change in overtime pay, to change our regulations accordingly, and recommended that GS-10°s and below actually be paid for overtime, and 11°s and above be allowed to elect either to receive overtime pay or compensatory time off. Colonel White also pointed out that this change in our regulations had been concurred in by all concerned. Mr. Helms said he had not seen it and since DD/P experienced a good deal of difficulty in allowing its senior officers compensatory time, asked to see the regulation before it is published. The Director approved.
