Dear Senator Byrd:

STAT This is in response to your letter of 13 April concerning  
Mr. [REDACTED]

STAT [REDACTED] case was considered by the Agency under the  
same program which I described to you in my letter of 17 April on  
another case. He was advised on 28 October 1961 that he had been  
found to be surplus to our need for personnel in his career field and  
that his employment with the Agency would, therefore, be terminated  
in the near future. This action was taken under a manpower control  
program established over a year ago and some thirty employees have  
been released from the Agency under similar circumstances during the  
past year. As indicated in my previous letter, in [REDACTED] case, STAT  
as well as in the cases of other employees who were similarly determined  
to be surplus in their respective career fields, every effort has been  
made to place them in other career fields within the Agency. These  
efforts were unavailing in [REDACTED] case and he was advised on  
STAT 28 February 1962 that his employment would be terminated.

STAT [REDACTED] subsequently appealed his case to the Director of  
Central Intelligence who referred it to the office of the Inspector General  
for investigation before taking action. Following this investigation, the  
STAT matter was thoroughly reviewed by the Director who personally advised  
STAT [REDACTED] by letter dated 19 March 1962, of his decision to deny the  
appeal. Accordingly, [REDACTED] employment was terminated  
effective 6 April 1962.

I would like to again emphasize that employees released under this program are not being separated for poor performance or for misconduct or as security risks. I would also like to point out that [ ] is eligible to receive, and has in fact applied for, an Immediate Civil Service retirement annuity.
