DD/I advised that the Task Force  report is negative.



Maury advised that Congressman Rivers and staff are still worried about whether there is a Cuban plot behind the hijacking incidents.

Houston briefed on the case of impersonation of a CIA officer, which is going to trial in Pennsylvania.

DDCI reminded that the Navy will be on hand in force at Headquarters next Wednesday in that three Vice Admirals and fourteen Rear Admirals, who comprise the top advisors to the Chief of Naval Operations, will be on hand for a day's briefing. The Director agreed to join the group during an informal discussion between 1530 and 1600.
