

### Slovak Separatism

The Council of Free Czechoslovakia, the political organization of the Czechoslovak exiles in the free world, has been informed that the Slovak separatists in the United States want to "commemorate" the so-called Slovak independence day, March 14, when 20 years ago Hitler forced on the Slovak people the so-called independent Slo- vák state so as to disrupt and decompose democratic Czechoslovakia.

These Slovak separatists are trying to misuse many uninformed democrats especially in the United States of America to gain support from them for a "commemoration" in New York, Cleveland, Pittsburgh and other cities and to gain from American politicians a declaration for a so-called Slovak independence.

It certainly is a regretful occurrence that the former so-called Minister of Foreign Affairs of the so-called independent Slovak state, imposed upon Slovakia by Hitler, Ferdinand Durcansky, who was declared by the democratic Czechoslovak government (1945) a war criminal and collaborator of Hitler, has been admitted to the United States although the Department of State had assured the representative of democratic Czechoslovakia that Dr. Durcansky never would be admitted to this country.

The United States never recognized the so-called independent Slovak state (Slovak Republic) but always continued to recognize the existence of a free and democratic Czechoslovakia, which is now unfortunately under Communist domination.

It would therefore be unfortunate to support even by declarations and statements a tendency to disrupt and decompose Czechoslovak unity.
