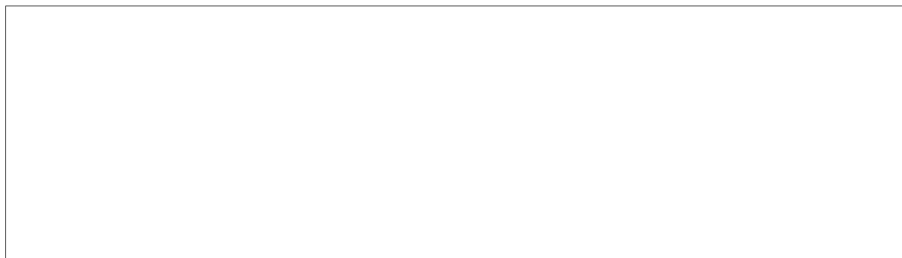

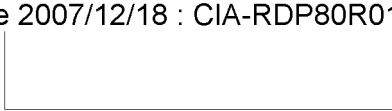
b. FY 1954 Escapee Budget (PSB D-18a/5)

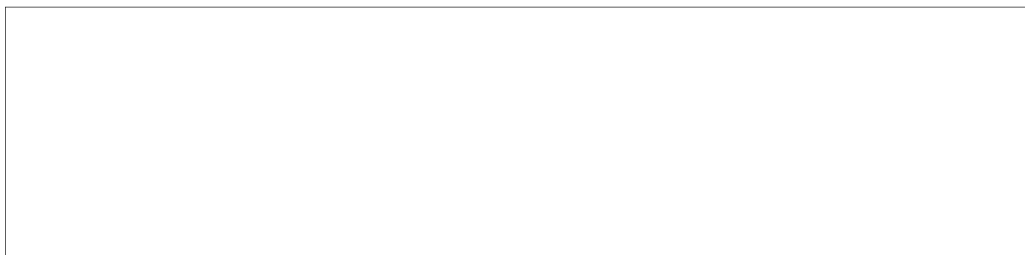

states from the Soviet yoke. It was apparent this was a delicate topic in view of the imminent change of Administration, but Admiral Kirk was authorized to have his own staff make a kind of tentative exploration of what this project might mean.

3. Doctrinal Warfare

A Study by a panel, with Mr. Francis Stevens of the State Department in the chair, is in progress. The Board indicated its desire to have a brief, one-page presentation at the January 15 meeting on the progress of this study. This item is not to be on the agenda for the formal meeting, but in the event any pattern is evident from the preliminary study, the Board would like to be apprised thereof.

✓ 4. FY 1954 Escapee Budget (FSB D-18a/5)

The Board was informed of the negative attitude of the Bureau of the Budget in this respect.
