

MESSAGES FROM MR. GREW TO GENERAL EISENHOWER.

Mr. Grew was particularly anxious that I convey the following personal messages from himself to General Eisenhower:

1. Mr. Grew attaches the greatest importance to General Eisenhower's acceptance of the invitation which will be extended to him formally to become a member of the Executive Committee of the National Committee for Free Europe, Inc. Mr. Grew feels the moral support which General Eisenhower's willingness to serve would provide to himself and all the other members of the committee is impossible to overestimate. General Eisenhower's acceptance will have a great bearing upon Mr. Grew's ability to obtain the acceptance of the other persons of importance and stature which the Committee must have in order to be completely successful.

2. Finally, Mr. Grew desires General Eisenhower to know that his understanding that General Eisenhower thought well of the concept of the Committee and might under certain circumstances be prepared to accept membership, had the greatest effect upon his own decision to accept the Chairmanship.
