MEMORANDUM

[redacted] who two weeks ago had sent Mr. Dulles  
 a memorandum on [redacted]  
 [redacted] called Mr. Dulles several times yesterday and today, and  
 being unable to reach him spoke to me. He was interested in  
 finding out what reaction there had been to his paper. He in-  
 dicated that he would be happy to come down to Washington and  
 talk with those concerned about it. He noted in passing that  
 [redacted]  
 [redacted] had both seen the memorandum and had "recommended" it.  
 He noted also that he had sent a copy to the Chief of Information  
 of NATO but because of the Lisbon meetings was not surprized that  
 he had heard nothing of it.

I told him that the memorandum was being studied by those  
 concerned in this Agency and that I knew nothing of their views  
 as to whether it was a valuable suggestion or not. I took his  
 telephone number [redacted] and said that either I would call  
 him back or would have someone call him respecting the memorandum.

I checked with [redacted] to whom this memorandum had been  
 referred and found that it was still being studied in his shop.  
 [redacted] called later in the day to say that he had had an evalua-  
 tion of the suggestion in the memorandum, essentially negative in  
 character, and offered to talk with [redacted] himself by telephone.  
 He intends to do this tomorrow. He will politely note that the  
 suggestion though interesting is for the time being impracticable.
