MEMORANDUM FOR GENERAL WALTER B. SMITH:

SUBJECT: Far East Command Interim Report on Psychological Warfare Plans dated August 27, 1951, and Department of the Army Comments on Same.

At the request of the Chief, Psychological Warfare Special Staff, U.S.A., the Chief of the Joint Subsidiary Plans Division (JSPD) has furnished the Psychological Strategy Board with the Far East Command Interim Report on psychological warfare plans, together with Army comments on same.

Careful review of the implications contained in this report suggests a requirement for the Central Intelligence Agency to consider the development of a covert support plan to achieve the desired psychological objective.

Additionally, it appears that the larger question of a long-range plan may properly come within the purview of the Psychological Strategy Board planners, particularly to attain definitive answers to the following:	25X1
