SUBJECT: Intelligence Committee for the Foreign Information Program and Planning for Overt Psychological Warfare

ILLEGIB

1. The National Security Council is currently considering, and probably will approve the Report to the National Security Council, dated 20 December 1949, providing for the conduct of the national information program in time of peace and the planning for overt psychological warfare. NSC 59 provides for the establishment within the Department of State of an interdepartmental organization consisting of a policy consultant, a CIA consultant for matters relating to planning the NSC 10 series, and an interdepartmental staff. On the staff, Agency is represented by a full time member whose responsibilities act as a foreign intelligence adviser to the interdepartmental org

2. In order to mobilize the foreign intelligence effort of the Department for the purpose of more effectively supporting the national information program and planning for overt psychological warfare, like to activate an intelligence committee to serve under the chairmanship of this Agency's representative on that interdepartmental staff.

3. Will you, therefore, at your earliest convenience, designate a member of your organization to serve on this intelligence committee, place and time of meetings, together with its substantive work, will be determined by the committee in the light of demands made upon it.
