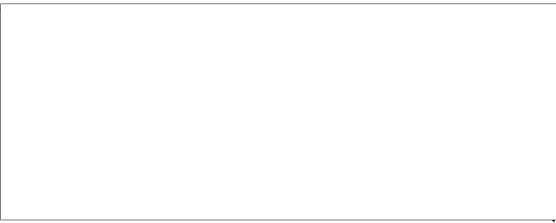

LEADING EXECUTIVES IN NORTH KOREA

The following names of North Korean leaders have been extracted from issues of the following North Korean newspapers:

<u>Minchu Choson</u>	(Democratic Korea),	official government newspaper
<u>Notong Sinmun</u>	(Labor Press),	official NKLP newspaper
<u>Nongmin Sinmun</u>	(Farmers' Press),	official newspaper of the NK youth organization.
<u>Minchu Chongnyon</u>	(Democratic Youth),	official newspaper of the NK youth organization.
<u>Hwanghae Ilbo</u>	(Hwanghae Daily News),	official newspaper to the government of Hwanghae Province.

Communist leaders in North Korea today trace their political lineage from four sources. In the column marked "affiliation," these sources mean the following:

(1) NKLP -- Those members of the present North Korean Labor Party who have spent most of their lives in Korea and became members of the NKLP when it was founded.

(2) SKLP -- Those members of the present NKLP who were originally members of the South Korean Labor Party and who moved to North Korea when the SKLP was outlawed by the ROK government.

(3) Soviet Union -- Those members of the present NKLP who have lived and received most of their political education in the Soviet Union.

(4) Yanan -- Those members of the present NKLP who have lived in China or Manchuria and who received most of their political education from the Chinese Communists.
