- 1. The injunction issued by the United States District Court in United States v. Snepp pertains only to "manuscripts or other writings" prepared by Snepp "concerning CIA, its activities, intelligence activities generally or intelligence sources and methods gained during the course of or as a result of employment with the CIA" (emphasis supplied). Thus, the injunction would not apply to a speech made by Snepp.
