This school was built in September 1956, on the site of a similar school, built during Japanese occupation but destroyed during Korean Hostilities. [redacted] selected officers and NCO's from each division, NKA, were sent to this school for training toward higher grades and positions. Source estimated total enrollment at approximately 150 students.

Five metal tanks, approximately 3 meters in diameter, extended approximately 5 meters above the ground. This was reported to be main water supply for the city of Wonsan. [redacted] the tanks extended into the ground for a considerable distance, but he could not estimate how far.

This school was established in October 1957, and students were selected from local schools. A total of approximately 150 students were in attendance and [redacted] the training course lasted for approximately 3 years, with distinguished graduates sent to NKAF Pilot Training School, Wonsan Airfield. [redacted] all prospective students of this school underwent rigid background and security investigations prior to final selection.

58. Oil Refinery:

It was originally constructed during Japanese occupation, and completely destroyed during Korean Hostilities. This site, approximately 500 meters long and 300 meters wide, was bounded by a barbed wire fence on the south side; northern side faced the Sea (Yong Hung Bay). After Hostilities, bulky iron "devices" were imported there, but Source could not give date of importation, country of origin, nor type of devices. According to him, the refinery was not believed to have fully regained its original operational status, but was assumed to be at least half operational.

Source observed army tents and vehicles at this location, but was unable to identify the type of installation.

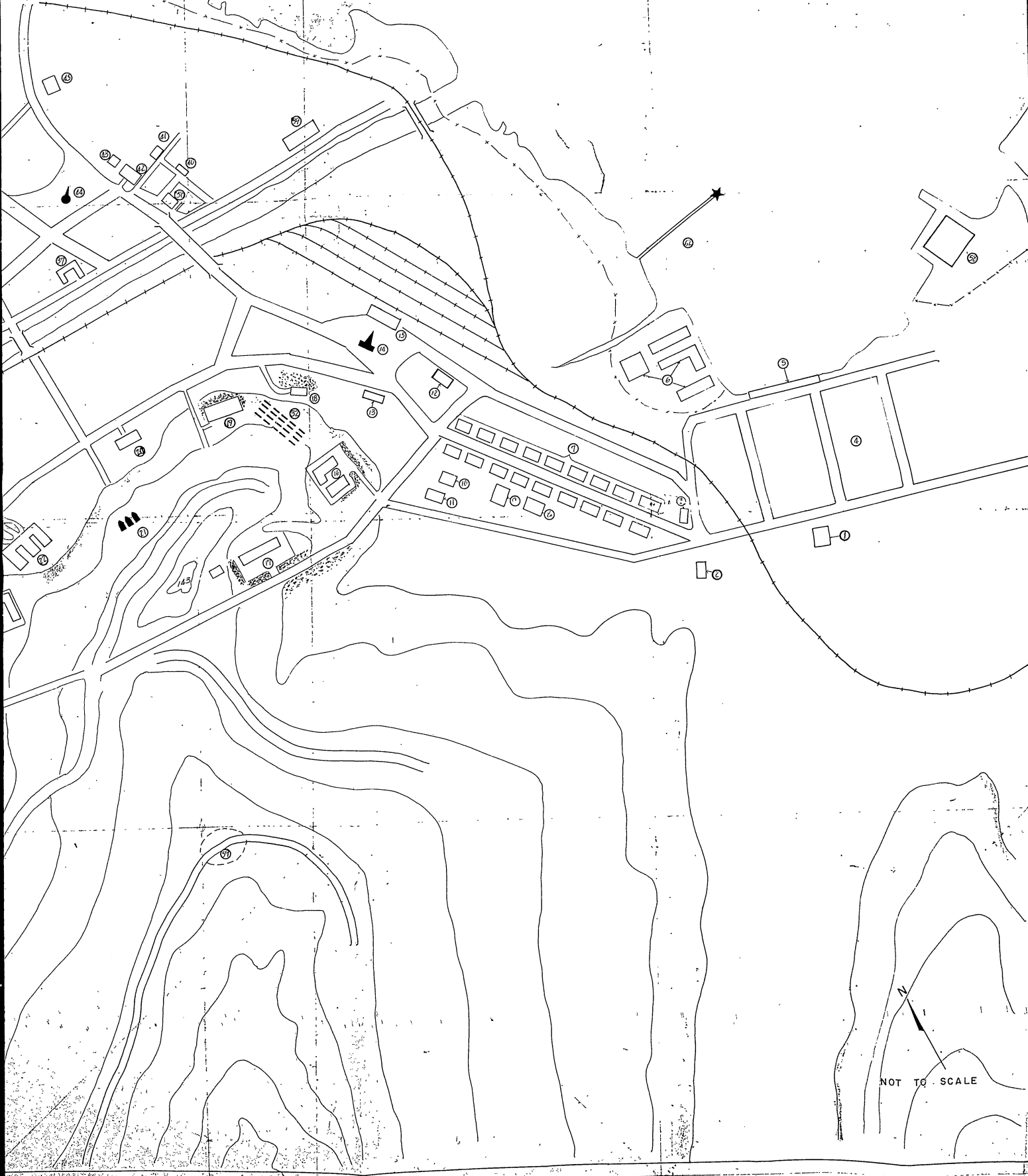

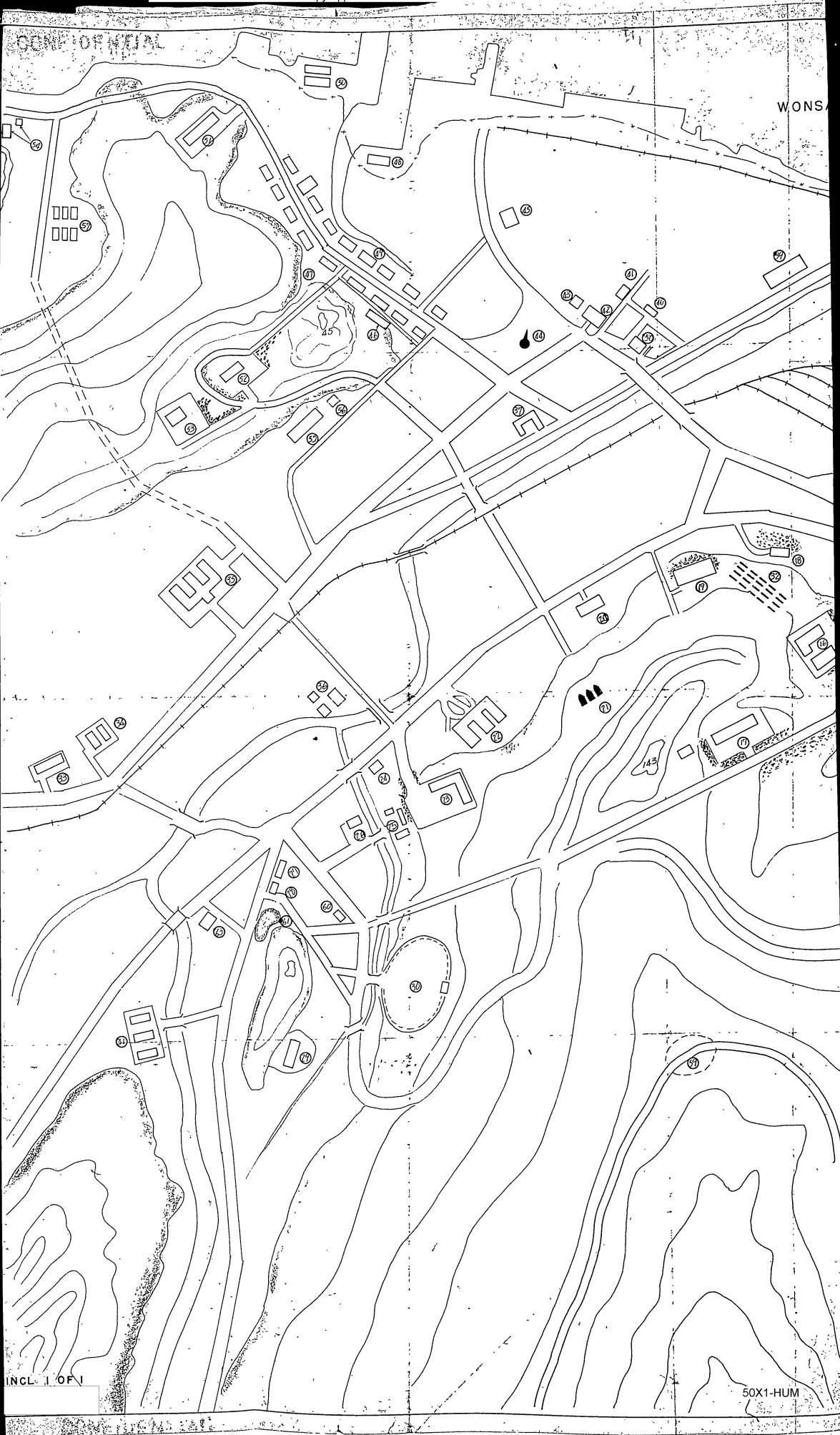
WONSAN CITY PLAN
