MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Conversation with Secretary of State,
12 May 1980 [redacted]

1. Ron Spiers (D/INR) sat in on the meeting. I went through the discussion outline point by point. [redacted]

2. On the PDB, he did not indicate a preference for either a substantive person to deliver it or writing notes. I told him we would do either or both. I pointed out that he might get a little more wholesome answer if it were staffed and returned to him the next morning. We'll just have to wait and see what he says as time goes on. [redacted]

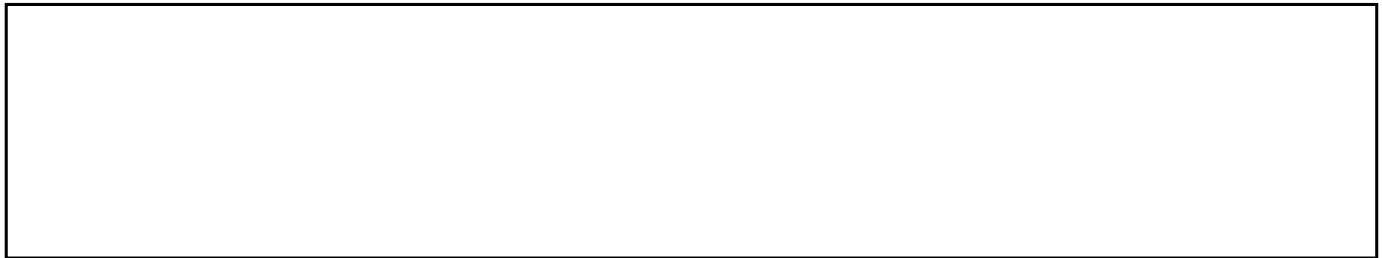
3. I showed him a number of our products. He showed genuine interest in them. I told him we would tailor anything to his needs. [redacted]

4. He asked if for his forthcoming meeting with Gromyko we could provide him any information on what might be on Gromyko's mind. I told him that we could have our Soviet experts try to deduce what Gromyko might raise, but that in this case we were [redacted] Let's do a hasty look at whether we can get something together for him that we could send by message that would forecast Gromyko's outlook at this time. [redacted]

5. We talked about the Presidential briefs and his coming. I didn't get any specifics on areas that he wanted covered, but when I told him we might do a Southwest Asia-Middle East regional survey he thought that would be helpful. [redacted]

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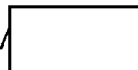
11. The Secretary was very tired and very behind schedule. [redacted]

DCI met with Senators Muskie and Bellmon (R., Okla.), Chairman and Ranking Minority Member respectively of the Senate Budget Committee regarding intelligence budgetary information. Senator Muskie favored an open budget.

Received briefing by [redacted] on verification aspects of the SALT II Treaty, February, 1979.

As Chairman of the Budget Committee, Senator Muskie expressed an interest in the Agency's assessment of the world grain situation and outlook for the next year and a half. Our report, entitled "World Supply and Demand for Grain, 1979/80", was prepared in response to this request and forwarded to the Senator in September, 1979.

Received a briefing on the current situation in Afghanistan and Iran, January, 1980.

Senator Muskie in his capacity as Chairman of the Senate Budget Committee was in the chair when the DCI briefed that Committee on 26 February 1980 on the Worldwide Wrap-Up.

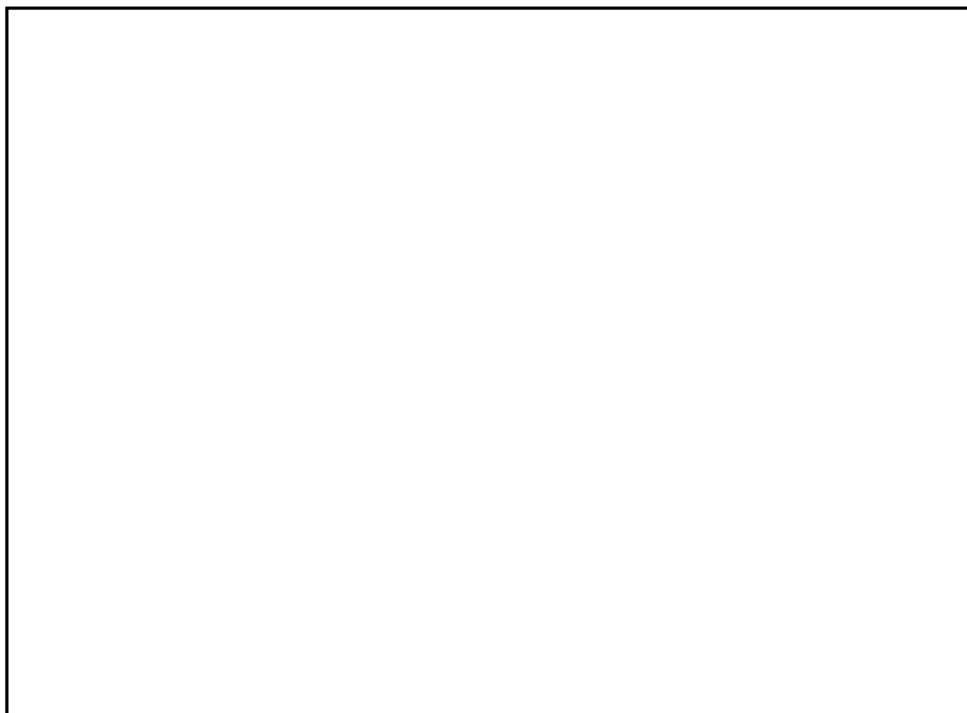

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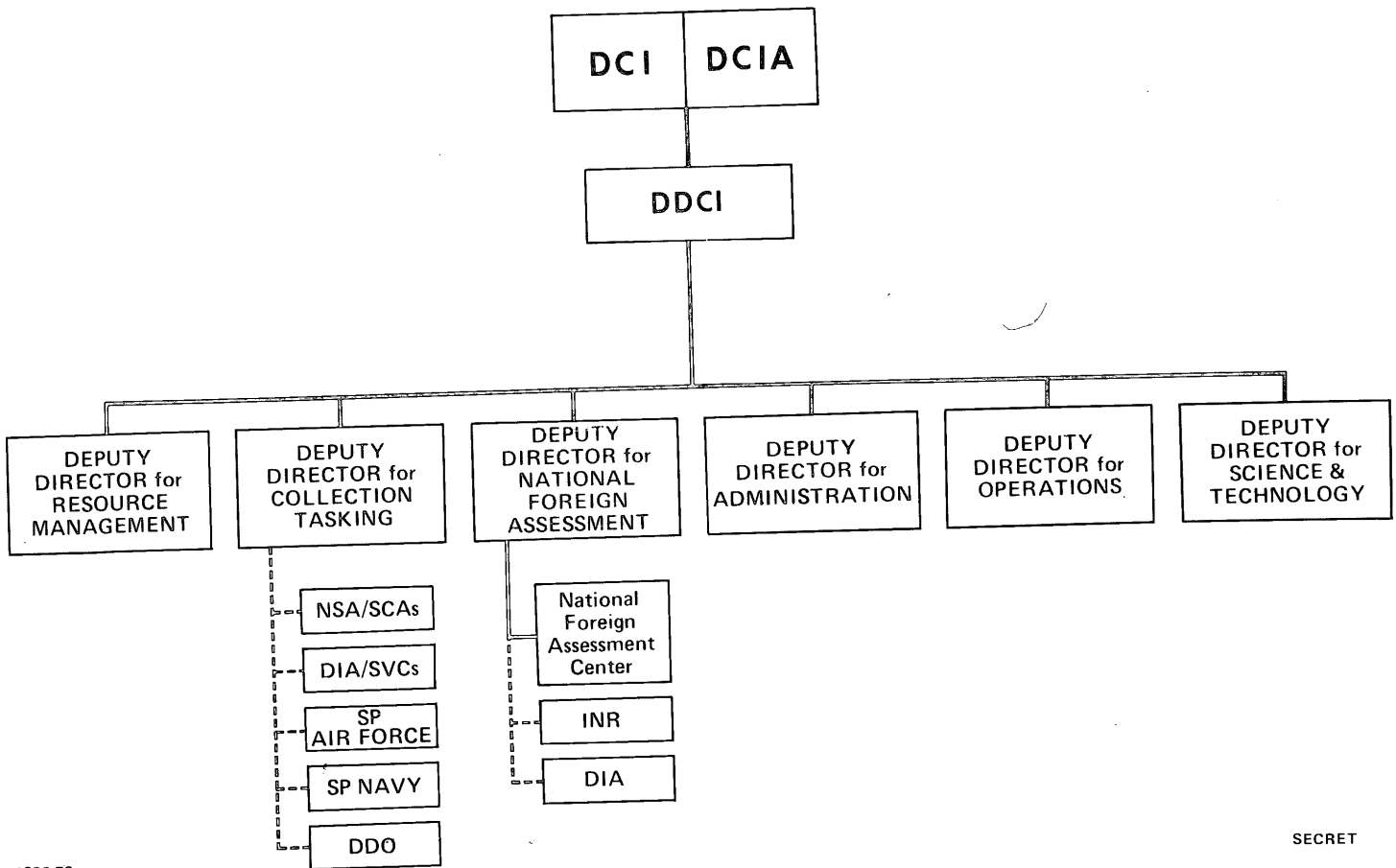
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General

- Intelligence advisor to President and NSC
 - Especially to SecState (ZB, SecDef)
 - Intelligence input to crisis management situations
 - Provide intelligence perspective at SCC, PRC, NSC meetings
- Regular meetings with President, SecState, SecDef and ZB
 - Meetings with President
 - ~~Originally weekly, now biweekly~~
 - These have been:
 - (1) crisis oriented (a lot since November)
(Note: ~~Do you want to discuss Rescue???~~)
 - (2) substantive briefings (regional, country, topical)
 - (3) review of key issues, problems *in full ops, programs*
 - Purpose has been to provide intelligence assessments, judgments on key foreign policy concerns
 - Meetings with SecState
 - ~~Fried~~ weekly (schedule permitting)
 - Object
 - (1) Brief SecState on what briefed President
 - (2) *Determine* Address SecState concerns & *what IC can help with*
 - (3) Deal with Agency-State issues
 - Glad you're now attending Presidential Briefings
 - Hope to provide overview (by key regions) of key issues for consideration, discussion
 - Any region you would like to have me touch on at 21 May meeting (Middle East, Europe, Central America)?
 - What is useful for me is feedback
 - Policymaker's key concerns so can focus Community productively
 - Your attendance at Presidential Briefings will help
 - Regular meetings with you help more
 - Most useful, too, would be opportunity to meet with you (& Brown, ZB, Pres.) when you meet and discuss your major foreign policy concerns
- Like to touch, at this first meeting, on only a few areas that you should be aware of

PDB Talking Points for DCI Meeting with Senator Muskie

- I. Three copies -- Brzezinski for President and Vice President, Brown, and you
 - A. Enables us to use most sensitive intelligence material
 - italicized in text or occasionally on separate red-border sheet
 - B. And address ongoing policy issues not appropriate for wider-dissem NID
- II. Written with President's schedule/interests in mind
 - A. Present format reflects his desire for
 - broader coverage of world events
 - detail on Iran/Afghanistan
- III. Deliver to your office early a.m. at your convenience (every day but never on Sunday)
 - A. Courier will wait while you read and return with copy.
 - B. Can cable when you are out of town.
 - C. President gets copy by facsimile transmission when at Camp David
- IV. Welcome your questions/comments
 - A. Can be written on PDB; we will get back with response
 - B. Always interested in suggestions of subjects deserving coverage.
- V. Per the President's instructions, the PDB is not to be shown to subordinates or staff

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DESCRIPTION OF APPROVAL PROCESS

Generation of Proposal

May come from any agency or the White House

Development of Proposal

- Consultation at Political Intelligence Working Group (PIWG)
- Consultation with appropriate ambassadors
- Consultation by the DDCI with Under Secretary Newsom or by Operations Directorate officers with their geographic counterparts, usually at the Assistant Secretary level.

Preparation of Proposal

CIA prepares a paper for distribution, via NSC channels, prior (usually) to the SCC meeting. Drafting and coordination is handled on a compartmented basis. Within CIA, we coordinate with NFAC, OGC, OLC, and the Comptroller.

If the SCC approves, the Presidential Finding is forwarded to the President for his signature. After the President signs the finding, appropriate committees of Congress are promptly briefed.

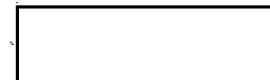
