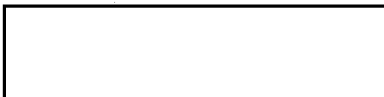


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46. LEGISLATION Attended as an observer

IC Staff. (See Memorandum for the Record.)

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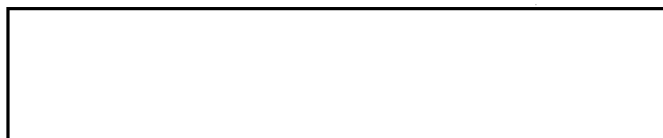
47. LEGISLATION Met with Ron Gainer and

the Federal criminal code. OGC,

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48. LEGISLATION Called Bob Carlstrom, OMB,
to ask if the Administration had formulated a position on H. R. 10400.
Mr. Carlstrom stated that there is no Administration position at this
time. He also indicated that the hearings scheduled for 16 February 1978
at which Attorney General Bell is slated for testimony have now been
postponed until 28 February. Mr. Carlstrom informed me that the
staff attorney in the Department of Justice handling H. R. 10400 is Dave
Barrett.

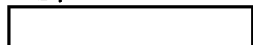
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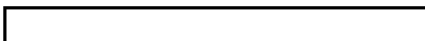

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6. [] LIAISON Sent via courier to Harris Miller, Legislative Director for Senator John A. Durkin (D., N. Y.), several maps of the People's Republic of China, the Soviet Union and Panama, per his request of yesterday.

7. [] LIAISON Sent via courier to Karen Kennedy, in the office of Senator Dennis DeConcini (D., Ariz.), a copy of Presidential Directive NSC-17, per her earlier request.

8. [] LIAISON Ms. Judith Schneider, of the Senate Select Committee on Ethics staff, on 7 February 1978 reviewed two folders containing documents previously reviewed by Paul Michel, of the Department of Justice, and judged pertinent to Congressional investigation of [] attempts to influence Congress. Ms. Schneider also reviewed material pertaining to Item #24 of the Committee's letter of 9 January 1978. Notes taken during this session are being reviewed by DDO for classification and sanitization. [] will advise OLC when the notes can be couriered to Ms. Schneider.

9. [] LIAISON Per [] request forwarded to Elliot Maxwell, of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, the eighth release of the BLUEBIRD/ARTICHOKE documents. This consisted of 455 pages and is unclassified.

10. [] LIAISON/FOIA In response to a letter forwarded by Senator S. I. Hayakawa's (R., Calif.) San Francisco office, I called and spoke with Miss Bonnie Hunter, of the Senator's staff, to solicit more information about the individual on whom CIA is requested to search its files. Reverend Michael M. Kan is seeking information from OSS files on locating a [] whom he knew in China back in 1944-1945. I explained to Miss Hunter the difficulties we might have in searching our files without a given first name; the variants of the [] name; and that the OSS files in our custody would not necessarily have information on the current whereabouts of any individual. Miss Hunter understood the difficulties and said she would try to seek additional information from Reverend Kan, especially at my request, whether Reverend Kan had written to the Department of the Army, did he receive any leads from the Federal Communications Commission [] (was an official Armed Forces disc jockey); and who it was who suggested CIA would have [] file, to give us some leads for our search. Miss Hunter will be back in touch with me after contacting Reverend Kan.

[Redacted] LIAISON Called Mike Epstein, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, concerning the request of Mr. John Gavin, Department of Justice General Counsel's Office, to [Redacted] Deputy General Counsel of the Agency, requesting access to the chapter "Budgetary Oversight" which was omitted by the Church Committee in Book I of its report for security reasons. A copy of the report in OLC files was reviewed by [Redacted] Comptroller, and he saw no objections to providing it. According to [Redacted] Gavin is preparing a low-level study on the funding of proprietaries and wanted to review information on that subject in the report. Epstein did not see any problem in granting access but requested that Mr. Gavin make his request directly to the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence. [Redacted] was so advised and will inform Gavin accordingly. [Redacted] earlier had given an indication that Gavin had discussed this request with Bill Miller, Staff Director, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, and needed Agency clearances.

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25X1 Talked later in the day with Epstein on another matter. I informed him that the letter from [Redacted] to Bill Miller, Staff Director, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, was finalized and would be delivered tomorrow morning by special courier.

25X1 16. [Redacted] LIAISON Called Professor G. Robert Blakey, Chief Counsel and Director, House Select Committee on Assassinations, and expressed [Redacted] concern that it should be made clear that the information derived by the Select Committee from the review of the Church Committee transcripts will be covered by the Memorandum of Understanding between the Select Committee and CIA. Blakey felt certain that this information would be covered in the disclosure section of the Memorandum of Understanding and will prepare a letter to the Agency concerning this point. He did not believe that a formal addendum to the present Memorandum of Understanding was necessary. I said we would agree with that when we see his letter.
