After 27 years of spreading knowledge into every nook of the old Bass mansion, Sister Mary Ida, librarian of Saint Francis College, must leave it all soon for a

Her tenure on one of the most picturesque campuses

in the country has presented the need for an even larger library structure. But it will be hard to match what has been done to provide an interesting and restful environment fo?

When Sister Ida came here with the college stall in 1944 from Lafayette the institution's library was confined to one room of the manse. Since then it has expanded in an orderly and unique way through all 36 rooms of the building - three floors and sub basgment. Most recently it invodes what used to be the college conservatory of music on the top floor a great domed chamber that ily ballroom.

Referred to almost reverently as "the upper room" by a cleaning lady, this vaulted place has been converted into a seventh-heaven of study and directly below it is one of the nation's rect collections of There has been serious effort to evaluate It but Sister Ida said it might be called "fabulous."

This has been her special pride since the assussination of President John F. . Rennedy and the coverage Includes even a sample of the champaguo alluro velvet that inged the presidentru castel. It discloses, too, the blie known fact that there were two caskeis.

It is a combined library of everything that has been printed about the Kennedy family and a collection of artifacts that has been made available through the ema-kable to earch of a Fort Wayne man-Donald B. Black-

Blackicell Makes A Fabulous Gift

Blackwell's is perhaps the most profound single contribution to the library which has been endowed from abroad by friends of Sister Ida and members of the library staff and others who chare Saint Francis as a worthy depository for materials pertaining to the Kennedys.

By reason of his contribution, Mr. Blackwell has become an official researcher for the college's Kennedy Library.

Whatever one needs to know about the late president may be found there and as in Arlington Cemetery,, a lamp glows day and night on the second floor to mark this treasure of massive research.

It is a part of the college's working library and students make use of it often. The newspaper clippings have been microfilmed for permanency and the artifacts made available by Biackwell are being catalogued as time permits. There are 20 or more volumes of Blackwell's work to come.
