1. The Center for the Study of Intelligence will conduct a Symposium on Creativity, Controls, and Ethics over a two day period, 29 to 30 March, 1978 (Wednesday and Thursday) A maximum of 60 officers, invited from throughout the Agency, will attend.

These topics have been discussed in various forums within the Agency including seminars sponsored by this unit, Office of Training courses (Mid-Career and Senior Seminar) and in Directorate sponsored meetings.
