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5. [Redacted] BRIEFING Accompanied [Redacted] C/DDO/IAD/CAS; [Redacted] DDO/NE; and [Redacted], Office of the Comptroller; to a meeting with Bill Miller, Staff Director, Dan Childs and Ed Levine, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, concerning the two most recent Presidential Findings. After a lengthy discussion, Miller said the Committee would probably ask for a formal briefing within the next two weeks.

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7. [Redacted] LIAISON Called Hal Ford, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, and asked him to report to Senator Adlai Stevenson (D., Ill.) that there was no development of such significance in the areas that he would be visiting soon, which he should be apprised of. I also expressed our gratitude for the Senator's willingness to raise issues abroad for us but said we did not need to ask for his assistance.

8. [Redacted] LIAISON Received a call from Mike Epstein, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, who asked what information the Agency had on the clearances of a friend of [Redacted] I asked [Redacted] NFAC, and a friend of [Redacted] to call Epstein.

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10. [Redacted] LIAISON Bruce C. Wolpe, in the office of Representative Henry A. Waxman (D., Calif.), called to ask two questions about current situations in Iran. Questions were prompted by interested constituents who are of Iranian extraction. First question was to what extent is there public support of recent military government installed by the Shah? The second question had to do with the status of Jews living in Iran? After checking with [Redacted] CSS/NFAC, I called Mr. Wolpe's office and in the absence of Mr. Wolpe, I provided the answers to another member of the staff.

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13. [redacted] LIAISON Called Casimir Yost, Legislative Assistant to Senator Charles Mathias (R., Md.), and informed him of arrangements I had made for his review of NFAC documents on Brazil and U.S.S.R. We agreed to 28 November at 2:30 p.m. for a briefing of Senator Mathias by [redacted] NIO/USSR/NFAC, prior to the Senator's trip to the Soviet Union.

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9. [redacted] LIAISON Met with Abram Shulsky, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, who said he would be traveling on vacation to Israel and France and asked if he needed any kind of Agency security briefing before he went. I told Shulsky I doubted it but would let him know.

10. [redacted] ADMINISTRATIVE DELIVERIES Delivered to Audrey Hatry, Clerk, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, a memorandum for Chairman Birch Bayh (D., Ind.) from Robert Gambino, D/OS, regarding clearance access for a new member of the Committee staff.

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memorandum from Stein to State, regarding the same subject, a letter from OGC regarding a log or index of material about CIA-academic relations that would have been made available to the Church Committee, and a memorandum for Senator George McGovern (D., S. Dak.), Chairman, Subcommittee on International Operations, Senate Foreign Relations Committee, from the Director regarding the Agency's liaison relationships with foreign intelligence services, all for Bill Miller, Committee Staff Director; and papers regarding Agency grievance procedures and channels for dissent, for Tom Crowley, of the Committee staff.

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12. [redacted] LIAISON Called Sam Hoskinson, NSC staff, and discussed the coordination of SALT related briefings and the respective requirements of Frank Moore's office, Assistant to the President for Congressional Liaison, and the NSC. Hoskinson promised to get back to us on this.

13. [redacted] LEGISLATION Talked to Earl Eisenhower, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, further concerning the bill H.R. 12171, which is still being held at the desk in the Senate.

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
