(Unclassified - DFM) BRIEFING *was* Talked with Stan Taylor, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, who said he had confirmed with [redacted] NFAC/CSS, his meeting with [redacted] NFAC/OWI, 25X1 on Soviet capability to detect U.S. nuclear submarines. Taylor said Ted Ralston, also of the Committee staff, would probably participate. The meeting is set for 3 March at 8:30 a.m.

(Unclassified - SF) LIAISON Received a call from Robert Foust, in the office of Senator Claiborne Pell (D., R.I.), concerning his receiving copies of the "International Energy Biweekly Statistical Review." He said his assistant had called a couple of weeks ago and requested that he be put on our list to receive these publications but to date he hasn't received any copies. After checking with [redacted] in [redacted] NFAC/CSS, office, I explained to him that we did indeed receive a call from his assistant, Rebecca Hierholzer, on 16 February, but by the time we had gotten the request approved it was too late for him to receive the first issue but that I would be glad to send him a copy of the back issue. He agreed to this and was most appreciative. A copy of the "International Energy Biweekly Statistical Review" was mailed to him the following day. 25X1

17. (Unclassified - SF) LIAISON Received a call from Ried Edwards, in the office of Representative George Miller (D., Calif.), requesting a copy of the Agency publication entitled "Prospects for Further Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons." A copy was mailed to Mr. Edwards the following day.

25X1 18. (Unclassified - SF) LIAISON [redacted] 25X1 of our office, hand delivered to Loch Johnson, House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence staff, a letter to Mr. Johnson dated today, signed by [redacted]. The letter provided a Trend Chart for CIA Personnel Under Cover.

25X1 19. (Unclassified - SF) ADMINISTRATIVE DELIVERIES Mr. [redacted] of our office, hand delivered to Thomas K. Latimer, Staff Director, House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, two copies of the National Basic Intelligence Factbook, one classified Secret and the other unclassified.

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39. [Redacted] BRIEFING Attended a briefing by [Redacted] NFAC/CSS, to Representative C. W. Bill Young (R., Fla.) on the Soviet military and civilian presence in Cuba. The briefing went well and there were no follow-ups.

[Redacted] BRIEFING Attended a briefing of Richard Perle and Dorothy Fosdick, staff members on the Senate Governmental Affairs Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations, on a white paper by ACDA on verification of SALT II by [Redacted] NFAC/SALT Support. [Redacted] briefing was outstanding and he diffused any possible controversy by the manner in which he discussed the Agency's input to the paper with Perle. There are two simple follow-up questions for which [Redacted] will develop answers.

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22. [redacted] LIAISON Called George Murphy, in the Senate Office of Classified National Security Information, to tell him that Don Gregg, SA/DO/O, had already left for the Hill and would be attending a briefing in S. 407 in the Capitol and he should contact Gregg directly for him to go over the necessary material with respect to the Panama debate.

23. [redacted] LIAISON Sam Hoskinson, NSC Staff, called referring to the communications between NSC and the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence on covert action approval mechanisms and said he had agreed to furnish the Committee with copies of the first series of Presidential findings signed by former President Ford.

24. [redacted] LIAISON Called Mike Epstein, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, regarding our response to Senator Daniel Inouye's (D., Hawaii) request for information on the original CIA documents that could not be located in other Executive department files and asked if this was the same matter Senator Lowell P. Weicker (R., Conn.) was interested in. He said it was, but that Senator Weicker was also interested in determining whether there were documents missing from CIA files with respect to KCIA activities in the U. S.

25. [redacted] LIAISON Called [redacted] NSA, and advised him that as a result of our session this morning with the Senate Appropriations Defense Subcommittee, Admiral Bobby Inman, D/NSA, would probably be asked a number of questions with respect to [redacted]

26. [redacted] BRIEFING Carolyn Ramsey, in the office of Representative Eldon Rudd (R., Ariz.), called concerning a briefing on the situation in Cuba, particularly the Soviet military buildup. She said the Congressman was a co-sponsor on the joint resolution urging President Carter to take steps to stop the Soviet buildup in Cuba but had not been invited to the Cuban briefing given to Representative Bill Young (R., Fla.), who was also a joint sponsor. I told her we would be happy to give him a briefing but it would have to be limited to Members only and we set 8 March, 9:00 a.m., as the time for the briefing.

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1. (Unclassified - RSG) LIAISON Called Jackie Hess, House Select Committee on Assassinations staff, to indicate that we had available material for review at Headquarters in response to the Committee request of 21 February 1978. The Committee request had sought a response no later than today.

2. (Unclassified - ABS) LIAISON Cathy, in the office of Representative Harold C. Hollenbeck (R., N. J.), called regarding obtaining for a constituent MKULTRA-related material which was mentioned in a newspaper article. I gave her the proper mailing address for our Information and Privacy Coordinator.

3. (Unclassified - THW) LIAISON I spoke with Tom Latimer, Staff Director, House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, on several occasions regarding the Committee's hearing on CIA and the media scheduled for 15 March. The conversations were, for the most part, centered around changing the date of the hearing from 15 March to some later date. After an initial agreement on a changed date, he called back and asked to switch back to the original date.

4. (Internal Use Only - THW) LIAISON I called Bill Miller, Staff Director, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, and asked him how Senator Henry L. Bellmon (R., Okla.) had reacted to our excisions with respect to the Panama debate. He said Senator Bellmon appeared to be relenting somewhat from his demands and felt that in the end the Senator would probably go along with the deletions. He said the material is scheduled to come up on the floor at 4:00 p. m. on Thursday and if no problems it will then go to the printer.

✓ 5. (Internal Use Only - THW) LIAISON Paul Powell, in the office of Representative Bill Young (R., Fla.), called asking for unclassified material with respect to the Soviet military buildup in Cuba. He said Representative Young planned to participate in a joint resolution against the buildup. After talking with [redacted] C/CSS/ NFAC, I told Powell we had no unclassified material and said we would be willing to come up and brief the Congressman on the subject. I also indicated to him to the best of our knowledge there was very little in the way of a Soviet buildup. A briefing was scheduled for tomorrow at 10:30 a. m. 25X1
