forwarded to Stan Taylor, of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence
staff, a paper entitled, "Systemic Problems in Intelligence Analysis on
the Soviet Union" which was forwarded to us from [redacted] of OTR. 25X1

25X1 7. [redacted] FOIA At the request of [redacted] called 25X1
Tom Packer, in the District office of Representative Henry Waxman (D., Calif.),
and provided him with the name and address of our Information and
Privacy Coordinator to satisfy a constituent request regarding a
MKULTRA related report which is available under the FOIA.

23. (Unclassified - HMS) LIAISON Sent a copy of an Agency publication, "National Basic Intelligence Factbook," to Rogene Waite, on the staff of the Subcommittee on International Development, House International Relations Committee, per her request.

24. (Unclassified - HMS) LIAISON Sent a copy of an Agency publication, "A Dollar Cost Comparison of Soviet and U.S. Defense Activities, 1967-77," to Beth Ryan, in the office of Representative Tom Corcoran (R., Ill.), per her request.

25. (Unclassified - HMS) LIAISON Received a call from Lynn Smith, in the office of Representative Barber Conable (R., N. Y.), requesting a professional employment application for a constituent. OLC Registry was advised.

[redacted] I told him that it was available through the FBIS wire at the Library of Congress, starting with Item #38.


28. (Unclassified - MMP) LIAISON Terry Finn, on the staff of the Senate Budget Committee, called with a request for a paper, preferably unclassified, on the potential for world oil in 1980. After checking with [redacted] NFAC/CSS, I told him that there would be an eventual update (not particularly soon, though) of the April 1977 - International Energy Situation: Outlook to 1985 paper. I asked him whether he received the Bi-weekly Statistical Supplement and after he told me that he did not, I registered his name for subsequent receipt of this publication with [redacted] NFAC/CSS.

He said that he was calling just to let us know what he was saying.
