25X1 15. [REDACTED] LIAISON Called Bill Miller, Staff Director,
Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, to see if he had any objection
25X1 to our sending to Representative Les Aspin (D., Wis.), House Permanent
Select Committee on Intelligence, the study sent to the Senate Select Committee
✓ in October 1977 on [REDACTED] Miller said by all means do send
it but to omit references to the Senate Select Committee.

I later arranged with Miller to meet with Agency and Department of
Justice representatives at 10:30 a. m. on 22 March regarding a Justice
Department position against providing a Congressional document to an
FOIA requester.

25X1 16. [REDACTED] LIAISON Received a call from Jean Evans,
Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, who said Pat Norton, also
of the Committee staff, was considering the possibility of open counter-
intelligence hearings in May related to Committee charter questions. Evans
asked our opinion of whether the following questions could be dealt with in
open session: the scope and nature of the threat of foreign intelligence and
security services, the kinds of activities needed in response to the threat
and the extent to which these activities impact on rights of Americans
provisions in the Committee proposals. Evans said he was also looking
for recommendations on whether there should be an Agency or FBI spokesman
or both.

25X1 17. [REDACTED] LIAISON Met for a half an hour with
Richard Haas, an American who is working with the International Institute
for Strategic Studies in London. Haas is preparing a study for the Institute
on the increased Congressional role in foreign policy and national defense
questions and its meaning for U.S. allies. One part of his study will be a
section on intelligence and Haas asked me several questions about
Congressional oversight of intelligence. He had previously talked with
25X1 [REDACTED] both of CSS/NFAC, on providing substantive
information to Congress. Everything I told Haas was unclassified.

25X1 18. [REDACTED] EMPLOYMENT REQUEST Received a
25X1 call from [REDACTED], in the office of Representative Berkley Bedell
(D., Iowa), who requested he be sent a professional application for
employment. OLC Registry was advised.

25X1 19. [] LIAISON Per his request, sent to Bill Vaughan, on the staff of the House Ways and Means Subcommittee on Trade, publications on steel problems of Less Developed Countries. Mr. Vaughan wanted this information for Representatives William A. Steiger (R., Wis.) and Charles A. Vanik (D., Ohio) who are attending a meeting in Geneva on this subject.

25X1 20. [] LIAISON Senator Lawton Chiles (D., Fla.) was briefed at his request on the People's Republic of China by James Lilley, National Intelligence Officer for China, [] ORPA, and 25X1 [] OSR. The briefing went well and the briefers answered all the questions raised by the Senator.

25X1 21. [] LIAISON Jim Bush, on the staff of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, called to ask if we ✓ could supply him with examples of things the Agency has made public such as press releases on current events, publications of intelligence products, etc. I said I would look into it.

25X1 22. [] LIAISON Received a call from Jaynie Victor, in the office of Representative William C. Wampler (R., Va.), on behalf of a constituent, requesting a copy of the "Report to the President by the Commission on CIA Activities in the United States," by Nelson A. Rockefeller, Chairman, in July 1975. After checking, I called Ms. Victor back and advised her that the constituent could obtain a copy by writing to the Superintendent of Documents, U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. 20402. She thanked me for the information.

25X1 23. [] LIAISON Received a call from Jay Killeen, on the staff of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, Thomas P. O'Neill (D., Mass.), requesting two publications: "World Steel Market Continued Trouble Ahead" and "World Shipbuilding: Facing up to Overcapacity." These were sent to him via courier and he was so advised.

He was searching for [Redacted] (10 December 1975) Memorandum from [Redacted] SA-D/DCI/RM, to the Field covering a report on Military Intelligence During an International Crisis [Redacted] Given the lack of success in locating the document, I have requested that [Redacted] of our office, attempt to acquire the document directly from IC Staff. Once acquired, I will pass the document on to Mike Flannigan for eventual passage to Diane LaVoy, of the Committee staff.

26. [Redacted] LIAISON Dick Giza, House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence staff, called asking for the CIA publication that was referred to in the 20 March 1978 Jack Anderson column. After checking with [Redacted] NFAC/CSS, I told Dick that there was no such publication (on U. S. oil usage statistics and, furthermore, the figures cited in Anderson's column are inaccurate). I added that, in any event, any figures that CIA might publish on U. S. oil usage or reserves are based on Department of Energy statistics rather than our own knowledge or analysis. This fully satisfied Mr. Giza.
