The Effects of the JIIRG Report on LAD

- 1. In order of priority we foresee the following major areas of impact:
 - a. Increase in Personnel Under the concept proposed by JIRO for basic reporting on a time period basis we foresee considerable additional requirements being levied as direct support on IAD. The basis for this will be the lack of analysis in depth of the basic report, the time frame in which they will be updated, the need for validation of reports published by other organizations (in particular DIAAP-1) and the need for supplemental information to support CIA analysts in supporting Agency views in preparation of NIEs.
 - b. Manpower Allocations Although related to the above the problem here is in the manpower allocated, in the JIIRG Report, for future needs within IAD. We feel the allocations presented are totally inadequate and are the result of very poor analysis of the present situation as well as the future. In discussion with JIIRG members they were willing to admit that their analysis may well be in error. The basic assumption that we are presently satisfactorily performing our assigned tasks is an example of their disregard for what we furnished and the Director signed in the Program Call. Their use of manyear figures that do not represent proven figures furnished by IAD further invalidate their figures. Figures that they presented in the report were as they put it "man looking through stereoscopes". This does not then include supervisory personnel down to and including most section chiefs. In order for IAD to perform its assigned functions these figures must be revised.
 - c. Support IAD can no longer depend upon NFIC to furnish photo lab, mensural, graphical, collateral, and publication support. Therefore, considerable manpower and money will be required in order for IAD to perform its primary function of direct or departmental support to CIA.
