BREDEL, WILLI

Born in 1901 in Hamburg; son of a cigar maker; became a metal worker and worked in shipyards of Blohm and Voss in Hamburg / active member of Social Democrat youth movement and was imprisoned for a year and a half during the Empire; right after first war, published his first novel, Maschinenfabrik M. and K., and also short stories about proletarian life / as member of Communist Party and prominent Communist writer, spent one year in Nazi concentration camp; after his release he escaped to Denmark, then to Russia and France / in 1936 published manifesto in favor of Communist official Edgar Andre of Hamburg who had been sentenced and was later executed by Nazis; published novel on German underground, Dein Unbekannter Bruder in 1937 / served in Loyalist Army in 1937; returned to Paris in 1938 and seemed very critical of official Communist policy; however, went to Moscow and became co-editor of Das Wort, literary review pub-

German sculptor / while studying in Paris married a Greek woman who is an ardent Nazi / HITLER loves Breker and has ordered vast amounts of sculpture from him; has given Breker huge place in Gruenewald, (Berlin) and pays his enormous debts for him. Breker's house is one of the very few places Hitler will go to for parties / is one of five German artists exempted from all fighting services by HITLER in 1939; others exempted are: Gustav GRÜNDIGELS, Gottfried MÜLLER, Wieland WAGNER (sp.v.) / Katina PAMINO (U.S.) also knows the Brekers.

Signed a recommendation with Dr. JORDA on January 11, 1943, on the relations between D.N.B. and T.P. in Turkey, and sent it to ^{von RITGEN} the German News Service in Berlin; at this time Brell was in favor of radical separation / discussed the problem with Mr. FIALA (q.v.), Dr. JORDA, and Dr. DIEZ on January 17, 1943; reached an agreement (as ordered by Berlin); and presented the proposal for approval to Berlin; proposed program is based on absolute separation outwardly while internal collaboration continues (this only concerns the news reports from Turkey and not the editing service); provides that the entire work from Turkey should be done by the D.N.B. with Mrs. ADERHOLDT transferred from T.P., and that the entire material will be put at the disposal of

T.P.; the staff will be as follows: Dr. JORDA as Chief of the entire D.N.B. Istanbul and with his editor Dr. STOLTZ Director of the Levant Service, Mrs. Aderholdt and Dr. LINCKE as well as the Turkish translator OSMAN make up the editing department; Mrs. Aderholdt with Iranian assistants is in charge of the D.N.B.-Iran reports; secretaries SCHWARZ and WELTER and a local stenographer serve the whole staff / other recommendations include the T.P. representatives moving out of the office previously rented by both; total expenses such as rent, office expense, salaries of assistants etc. to be paid by D.N.B. and later divided in Berlin; T.P. to receive one-third of D.N.B. Levant service announcements pending percentage decision by Berlin; the work of determining what material will be used by D.N.B. and T.P. respectively will be decided in Berlin or Vienna / "language regulations" (Sprachregelungen) of the press conferences of the Embassy are sent to him from Ankara; he plans to pass them on to T.P. for reports and comments on the situation.

Hitler's adjutant until end of 1940 / took part in Beer Putsch in 1923 which gave him strong hold on Hitler / tall, fat, easy-going, breezy; not clever, but Hitler believed him loyal / had innumerable affairs with society women and others; married wealthy girl whose family gave her villa in Grunewald; Brueckner found this expensive and began to embezzle Chancellory funds as did his old friend KANNENBERG; WIEDEMANN resented this blatant cheating and reported it to Hitler who was displeased at being told about his favorites; Wiedemann was lucky to get away to California instead of being liquidated / after Wiedemann's departure, Brueckner felt he could do as he pleased, and continued to embezzle; his wife divorced him because of a scandal; he lost his job late in 1940; reported to be either in prison or in Hohenlychen, special hospital for prominent Nazis or

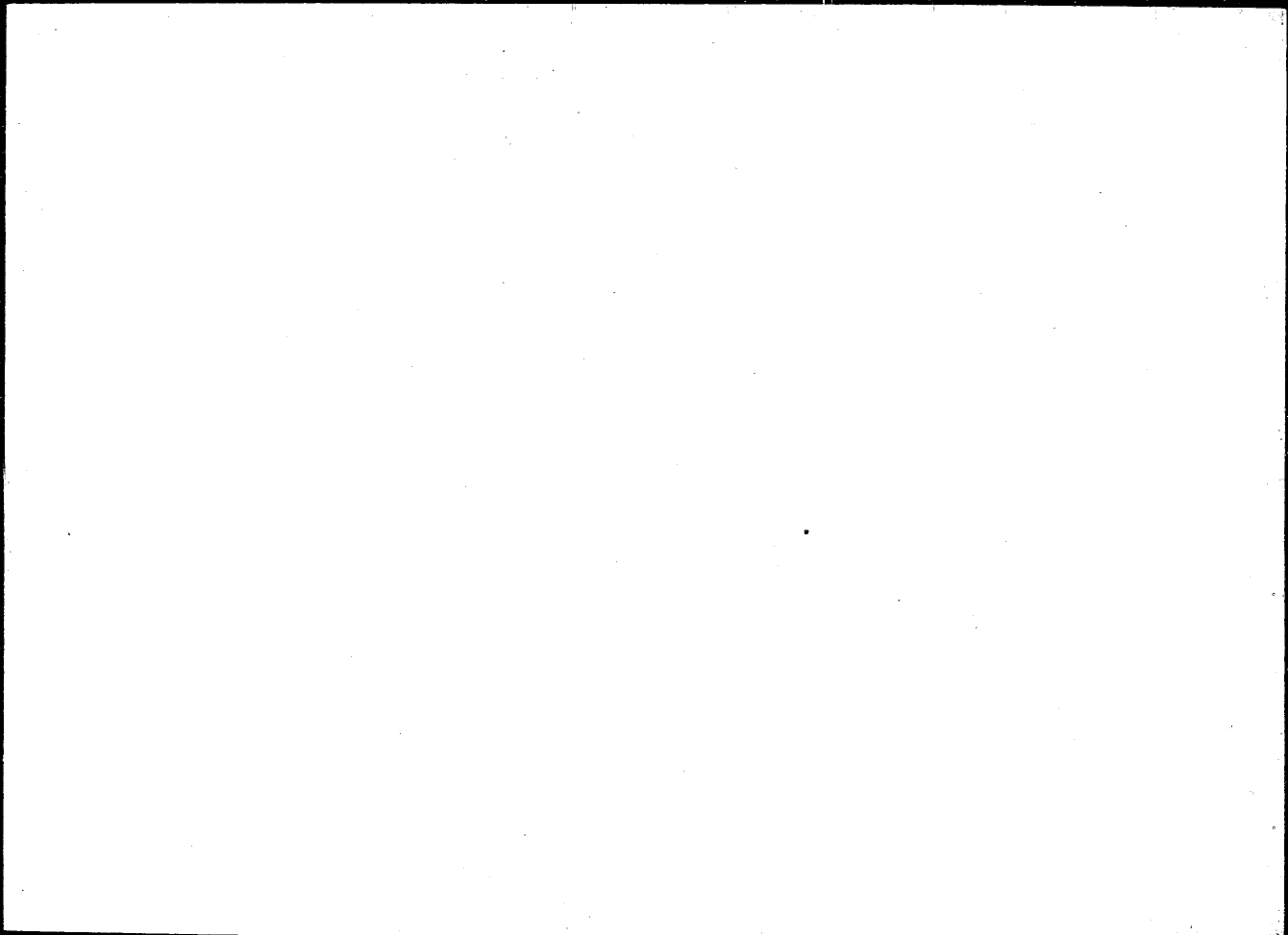
