According to an early biography, was originally named Levy but was permitted to change ^{him} ~~it~~; jovial Rhinelander, born 1890; divorced his first wife and now married to a dazzling blonde (q.v.) who competes hard for Hitler's favors; excessive drinker despite Hitler's efforts to stop him; lives in Berlin-Grunewald in 47-room house; formerly Jewish; has great tenacity, took daily lessons to overcome speech defect; concerned with problem of post-Hitler Nazi leadership, ^{and} devoted much time to "Ordensburgen" where future Junker leaders are trained; controls income of 600,000,000 marks; as chief of staff of Supreme Command of Political Organization of NSDAP, directs 2-3 million call leaders and "block wardens" who constitute his own secret police; works closely with Mimmeler (q.v.), particularly on even greater regimentation of private life; less resented by industry now that it has foreign countries to plunder than he was at

first; believes with Hitler in a national economy controlled by the Party, and to this end is destroying small businesses; with Rosenberg (q.v.), is working for a new social constitution closely resembling feudalism; makes foreign contacts through "Strength through Joy"; invited Duke and Duchess of Windsor (see Bahamas) to tour industrial districts; his organization recruited "workers of German blood" in U.S. many of whom sent such complete details of the plants they worked in that, in combination with Gestapo and military secret service, he built up a file on American industry which claims to be more complete than any in U.S.

About 45 years old; served in first war in 2nd Württemberg Dragoon Regiment; was awarded Iron Cross second class; made lt. in 1918 and first lt. in 1925 / served in 18th Cavalry Regiment until 1931 when he was transferred to staff of 7th Bavarian Division / became a major in 1936; served on staff of Military Attache in Paris in 1938 / in 1939 became a colonel and worked in attache section of High Command / became colonel in 1942 / his activities during first 2 years of this war are not known; is thought to have been chief of staff of 2nd Panzer Army under Col. General SCHMIDT in 1942; was transferred to Africa at an uncertain date; commanded 164th Light Division during the illness of Maj. General LUNGERSHAUSEN in December 1942 / was first identified by British as commanding the 21st Panzer Division in February 1943 / there is also a report (perhaps a mistaken one) that he has been returned to the 164th Light Division.
