THIERACK

Appointed Minister of Justice, President of Law Academy, Director of Juridical Office and Chief of Nazi Jurists; Schlegelberger retiring as acting Minister; by Hitler's proclamation Thierack can "disregard all existing law in carrying out his mission"; considered very hard-boiled and able to stave off domestic revolt for a long time; this is in line with Party control of Justice which has been increasing steadily since early 1942; more and more SS policemen are employed and courts are instructed to work harmoniously with them; consequently, ordinary citizen has no judicial protection whatsoever from arbitrary Nazi justice.

THIERACK, DR. OTTO GEORG

Reich Minister of Justice, formerly President of the People's Court. His instruction "to build up the National Socialist system of justice" even if it is necessary to "deviate from existing laws" indicates that the German courts are to be further subordinated to the control of the Nazi Party: succeeded Dr. Franz Güertner who died Jan. 28, 1941.
