One letter is signed HEDY, which is probably HEDY RIDDER who was at one time secretary to the German Legation at Quito. Writer mentions having seen SENOR GRIESBACH (there is an Ernesto Griesbach in Quito who is known to be a leading Nazi in Ecuador), SENOR SCHLUNDT, (Frederico Schlundt of Amato was a Nazi propagandist and Fifth Columnist who was repatriated on "Serpa Pinto"), LINDNER, (probably Robert Lindner of Bogota, Colombia said to have been repatriated

Born 1891 in Schieden-Lippe / son of High Bailiff / entered Navy in 1911, commanded torpedo boat during first war. / 1919 studied at College of Agriculture and in 1921 became Director of Chamber of Agriculture in Lippe / 1924 entered Reichstag as one of nationalistic young officers who gave parliamentary foothold to rearmament policy of Generals / he and BRÜNING (U.S.) became close to SCHLEICHER and von Hindenburg / ^{had} some connection with Naval Secret Service and knew CANARIS / broke with German National Party and in 1930 founded People's Conservative Party which was secretly behind Generals and rearmament / in 1930, under Brüning, became Minister for Occupied Territories, Minister without Portfolio and Commissioner for Eastern Germany, and finally Minister of Transport / in this
