The network in Tyrsuv Dum is subdivided into districts and units. The organization is a tripartite system. Furthermore, Prague is divided into three sectors: A, B, and C.

An illegal group of the formation is fully armed with light machine guns, carbines, pistols, and grenades. It has a considerable supply of ammunition. The commander of the group is Second Lieutenant Beran; it will be transferred to Colonel Jirikovsky.

The Ministry of the Interior has sent three doctors of laws to the western border region; armed troops and SNB formations are subordinated to them. The SNB formations are reinforced with motorized troops, because some units are unreliable.

Labor Camps: Kladno (~~etc.~~), Dubi, Hradec Kralovo, Terezin, Ilava, Pardubice (Hotel Imperial, center for arrested clergy).

Construction of Airfields and Storehouses: Connection with the USSR ^{by rail} at Cierna pri Cope is being expanded; 12 buildings have been erected so far ~~xxx~~ (see the plan). 800 persons are employed on the operations. 15 buildings and 8 terminal tracks are planned. The area of construction is 4 square kilometers.

Highways: The Kosice-Michalovec-Uzhorod road, the only automobile route between eastern Slovakia and the USSR, is being widened to 16 meters, and in some sections it has been asphalted.

Dams - Hydroelectric Plants: Kubine nad Ondavou, ^{built} Vysny Svidnik.

Cultural Houses - Barracks in Case of War: In the following towns: Geraltovce, Vysny Svidnik, Vranov ^{and} Topli ^{built}, Krompachy, Snina, Stachcin, ^{built} Stropkov. Cultural houses, which can serve as military installations in war, are being built. A house will hold 500 persons. Dimensions: 80 by 45 meters, ^{two} ~~three~~ stories, platform in front 200 by 400 meters (see plan).

Ceskomoravska - Liben:

The Sokol center in Prague III desires the following:

- 1) To arrange direct communication ~~it~~ with broadcasting stations, ~~to~~ designate codes and ciphers, and to establish wave length and time of transmission (it is necessary to make an agreement with the center concerning these matters). I have just informed the Czechoslovak intelligence service in exile of these matters, giving ^{it} ~~them~~ the location of the broadcasting stations for the purpose of realization sig. Please communicate directly with it, because it desires to send its people to Czechoslovakia for this purpose).
- 2) To what extent are acts of destruction and pamphlet activity to be carried out?
- 3) Is the illegal network to be expanded further, or is its ramification sufficient for the present?
- 4) Is the Prague-Ceska Trebova-Prerov-Puchov-Kosice railroad line to be blown up, in the event of further transport of our people to the ~~the~~ USSR? Give precise instructions concerning this!
- 5) What will be the material strength of direct support from abroad in the event of an uprising?

6) You will receive further questions through the broadcasting stations. In regard to military matters, I have handed them over to the previously designated places.

Regular Reports:

Unemployment is increasing. Unemployed members of the Communist Party of Czechoslovakia are accepted into the SNR and STB (State Security). Sabotage in production has been reported. The Communist Party is split into two factions: members who joined before 1945 and those who joined afterwards. A fight against the Sokols is being waged. The purge in ~~Tyrsov Dum~~ Tyrsov Dum was originally planned for 16 members; later eight were dismissed, including Vesely, the administrator of Tyrsov Dum (his nephew Evzen is working with me). ~~Kvarkxxxxxxxxxkxmbpckxkxkxk~~ Employees are closely checked. Late arrival is punished by fines and ^(assignment to labor) brigades. Persons without excuses are ~~handed~~ handed over to the labor office, and then sent to the regional headquarters of the SNR & [sic] and thence to the mines.

Opening of New Mines Near Pribram:

New deposits of uranium ore are being opened in the vicinity of Pribram. The ore is tested in the former metallurgical academy. Many new mines are being opened in a zone 5-6 kilometers southwest of Pribram; they are constantly being enlarged. About 20 Russian engineers are now working there, and living quarters for 60 more are being sought at the Radova Skola in Svata Hora. The monthly income of miners is 5-6,000 crowns, and large food rations. Political prisoners and German PW's are also working there; escapes are attempted. Two were shot in attempting to escape, as a warning to others. I will send more detailed information as soon as the report arrives.

Resistance of the Clergy and Believers Against Communism:

Incident in Svata Hora near Pribram:

At the time of the culmination of the resistance of Archbishop Beran to the Communist pressure against the church in June of this year, the

forbidden pastoral letter was read in all churches, including the one in Svata Hora near Pribram at the feast of Corpus Christi. The Svata Hora vicar read this pastoral letter, in spite of the fact that he had been emphatically warned in advance against the STB. 4-5,000 Catholic and non-Catholic believers were present; they came in spite of the fact that all special trains were cancelled and private automobiles and buses on the main highways were turned back before reaching Svata Hora. People came to the shrine on foot. 160 plainclothes STB members were present at the ceremony of Corpus Christi, who listened to the conversations of persons talking together in small groups, in order to arrest them later.

During the reading of the pastoral letter in Breznice, the local priest was arrested; the people arose spontaneously en masse, and demanded his release, threatening to stop work in the fields and artisan crafts. The priest was released, and was greeted with great ovations and a procession. The police did not interfere.

All priests who read the pastoral letter ~~have~~ are respected by the people. The ~~big~~ gulf between Catholics and non-Catholics is being bridged by these events.
