Gorodok which is about 30 kilometers west of Lvov had a popula-50X1 tion of seven - eight thousand. 50X1 The town had the usual means of transportation - bicycles and horse drawn wagons. Once a day busses travelled through the town enroute to other villages, towns, and cities. A railroad station was situated northwest of the town. The line was double track and came from Lvov and went westward to Przemysl. There were both passenger and freight trains going through the town. There were from four five passenger trains daily going through Gorodok. 4. The town had one main street which ran east and west going through the center of the city. It went east to Lvov and west to Sudovaya Vishiya. It was smooth asphalt paved and constructed in 1939-40. It was wide enough for two cars and a third car could squeeze by. Another fairly good road ran south from Gorodok to Komarno . It also was two cars wide, but stone and gravel surfaced. Whenever it rained this road became very muddy. The region surrounding Gorodok produced considerable dairy products. principal crops grown in this area were wheat, rye, beets, and oats. vegetables and fruits were also grown by each villager for home use or for bartering. 7. A public square was situated in the center of the town. 8. A Roman Catholic church was located in the northeast section of town near public square and one old brick Greek Catholic church was situated on the southeast corner of the square. 10	A small movie theater with seating capacity of 200 to 250 persons was located east of the public square. This theater presented stage plays and films.
1	. The majority of the homes had outside water wells where water was drawn by ha pumps or water buckets hauled up by ropes.
12	Homes, buildings, and small business establishments had electricity. A power plant was located north of town on a small lake.
13	A dairy station was on the southern outskirts of town. A one story combinati telephone station and post office building was east of the square on the road to Lvov. The same same state of the square on the
1	There was a small lake on the northern outskirts of town. Swimming was prohibited. Fishing was permitted. The most abundant type of fish found in the lake was carp. It was necessary to have a license when net fishing but not when fishing with a pole. If one, twas a caught net fishing without a license he was accused of an administrative crime against the days of
	town.
15	A bakery and a flour mill were situated on the lake, north of town.
16	Near the public square was a small police station. A court house, i.e. a three-story brick construction, was east of the square.
17	The town of Gorodok did not have any factories.
