Subcommittee's Evaluation of Itself (From Annual Report):

"There is no question but that the subcommittee has made a useful contribution to a better understanding of Sino-Soviet Bloc capital equipment trends. Moreover, by providing a forum for discussion there is a better understanding of the special problems of economic measurement in this field. There is, as a result of the subcommittee's activity, a wider knowledge throughout the Intelligence Community of the material available and its reliability. Analysts working in the same field have been brought together to discuss common problems. The subcommittee members are now much better informed concerning current research activities within the IAC agencies than heretofore and this should serve to reduce even further the duplication of research effort.

"All members of the subcommittee have taken this responsibility seriously.

Attendance at meetings has been uniformly excellent and participants have been well prepared. While the subcommittee feels that it has a first problem of placing a large quantity of completed research in proper perspective, it views its function as a continuing one of coordination and guidance in research planning.

"...the work load of the members remains the single most important impediment to faster progress. This condition, almost certainly, will not be improved."

Secretariat's Evaluation of SC Activities:

One of our newest subcommittees and already one of the very best. The initiative of the Chairman has been particularly important in developing an active program for reconciliation of interagency differences and review of important papers. The group is limited, however, by the fact that only two or three agencies are working on many segments of this field of analysis. Among these agencies, methodological differences have made agreement of many basic estimates extremely time-consuming but as a result of lengthy discussions, substantial agreement has been arrived at in a number of areas.
