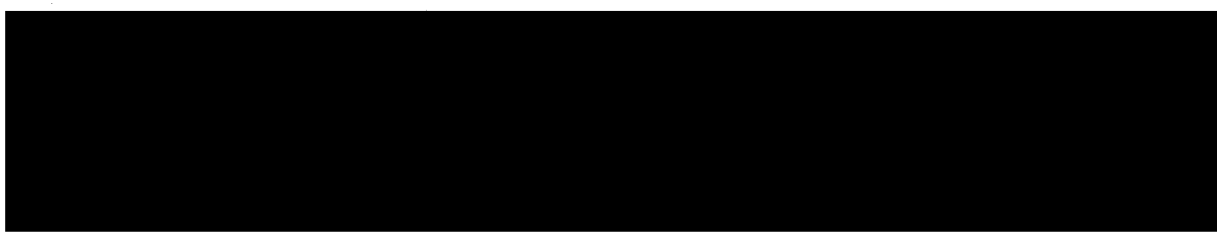

SUPPLEMENT



1. Malay political activity during September has been very slight. The Malay press continues to publish almost routine editorials exhorting the Malays to give their full support to the UMNO, but outside of this the situation is quiescent. One factor partially responsible for the current inactivity of all political parties in the Malayan Union is a shortage of funds. A steady return to the pre-war "old colonial outlook" is apparent among government authorities; the local population appears to be accepting this state of affairs.

2. An escaped Chinese trader from the Bagan Si Api Api area of Sumatra has appealed to the Chinese Consul in Kuala Lumpur for the protection of the approximately 18,000 Chinese in the area from Indonesian conflicts. Mr. HSU, the Chinese Consul in Kuala Lumpur, relayed the appeal to the Chinese Consul-General in Singapore, Mr. WU, who in turn appealed to Dutch and British officials. The British are "investigating" the situation but do not appear to have taken any action.
