The election of the new chairman is due to take place at the annual APP gales gates conference, scheduled for 17 November 1946. Both Chancellor Figl and State Secretary Graf have announced their intention of visiting the Tyrol to attend this conference.

7. Major Frank Molling

Major Molling is another of the intriguers. His closest associates today are Dr. Hans Blass, who attacked Gruber in front of the Innsbruck Landhaus on 27 September 1946, and Landesrat Dr. Oberhofer, who is about to retire from the Tyrolean Government. These three are still working for an independent and autonomous Tyrol. They are also still out for Gruber's blood, collecting material against him and seeking out anybody who is prepared to speak against him. An associate of this group is apparently the Dr. Grossmann whom the French once brought to Innsbruck as Police Director and who is now working for them in Baden. Recently, Grossmann told an acquaintance whom he met on the Arlberg express that the salvation of Tyrol lay in the appointment of Molling as Landeshauptmanne.

8. New Tyrolean Bundesrat

The SP in Tyrol has decided to nominate Ludwig Klein, editor of their local newspaper, <u>Die Volkszeitung</u>, as the Socialist Bundesrat for Tyrol. Klein's nomination will be submitted to the next session of the Tyrolean Diet. The APP deputies have decided to vote neither for nor sgainst him. They will, however, attack his nomination on the grounds that a Tyrolean worker would have been more suitable than "a Viennese Jew" who has lived in Tyrol for little more than a year.

9. Austrian Socialist Party

The SP is profiting from the present disintegration of the APP. It has received a tremendous boost through its overwhelming success in the railroad employees' elections and is convinced that it will be returned to power at the next general elections. Today it is seeking to win over some of the more respected and progressive APP supporter by assuring them that the forthecoming socialist government will be drawn exclusively from the party's moderate wing. In this it is meeting with a certain success; some of those whom it has approached argue that it is better to seek to exercise a restraining influence on the SP than to continue their vain attempts to resuscitate the

- 10. Local morele is deteriorating daily. On top of the blow concerning the status of the South Tyrol and the catastrophic food situation, came the electric power crisis. This, incidentally, strongthened the separatist movement in Tyrol, and caused bitter complaints against Vienna. Chancellor Figl wrote to Professor Camper, reprimending him for an article attacking Vienna.
- Il. The Communists are naturally doing their best to exploit the situation, increasing their propagands efforts, organizing food demonstrations, etc. Perhaps even more dangerous are the Nazis who are preaching everywhere the advantages of dictatorship. The cry for "a strong man" to take over is daily
 growing louder; while from former anti-Nazis such remarks as "It would have
 been better, after all, had we won the war" can be heard everywhere.
