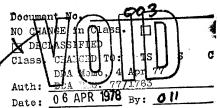

- dertain Slovek democratic leaders believe that the working agreement which their party reached with the Slovak Catholics just before the May elections, when both groups were alarmed about a possible Communist victory, cannot last much longer. Friction inside the party steadily increases, and the conservative "militant" Catholics are forming themselves more and more into a distinct wing.
- Party leaders are viewing with uneasiness the persistence with which the Catholic Slovak Democrats demand control of important party posts, evan when they are unable to present candidates with good political records. Catholic leadership continues to be more or less in the hands of Dr. Kempny, former Hlinka Party member and new a very active secretary of the Slovak Democratic Party. It is felt however, that much of Dr. Kempny's success in placing himself in the foreground of party affairs can be attributed to the frequent absences of Dr. Fedor Hodza, the Ceneral Secretary, from executive committee meetings. Dr. Kempny, in his effort to strengthen the Catholic position in the Slovak Democratic Party, has also been getting much assistance from Msgr. Andrej Cvincek, now Vice-Fresident of the Slovak National Council. The Catholic wing is strengthened, too, by the strong support it receives from the weekly publication Matolické Noviny, which has a circulation at present of around 140,000 copies per week.
