1. Wismar

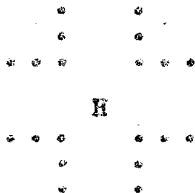
Near the harbor front about 500 yards north of the railroad station is an underground gasoline tank with a capacity, according to a notice thereon, of 25,000 liters. It is guarded by Russians and Germans.

2. Rostock Harbor

There are:

- a. Six minesweepers;
- b. Three freighters, each of approximately 3,000 tons, loading crates. The funnels were as follows:

(2) Blue with a "B" on a white diamond-shaped ground.

(3) White with a black "H" thereon.

- c. Five destroyers, single-funneled, thought to be formerly of the Germany Navy, were observed in the Neptune Yards, one of them in drydock.

3. Stralsund

Six motor launches, formerly belonging to the German Navy, with Russian crews, are stationed in Stralsund harbor.
