- 25X1 1. In a meeting on 20 February 1947 of leaders of the movement for the incorporation of Kladsko, the chairman of the Parliament, Mr. Joska David, and members of the Foreign Affairs Committee, plans were laid for immediate future action, aimed at adding Kladsko, Ratibor and Hlubciako to Czechoslovakia.
- 25X1 2. The following plan was devised: Foreign Minister Jan Masaryk will be on the agenda of the plenary session in Parliament, devoted to the debate of foreign policy, after his return from London. In the discussion following the speech each party, including the Communists who might also be persuaded to support the move, will send members of Parliament to speak in behalf of the national demand for the territories. Mr. David will permit a vote on the official resolution which will express the nationalist demand of the Parliament for the territories.
- 25X1 3. This is the planned implication of such a resolution: The government will be forced to take cognizance of the rising internal pressure for the territories and might be compelled to seek the support from the western allies, if the Poles prove themselves obstinate within the framework of Slavic negotiations.
