1. The Soviets have set up an airfield at Koksharovka (134-04, 44-33). The gas and oil supplies for this field are dispersed over fourteen separate areas. Figures on the field are as follows:

North-South runway:	4.7 kilometers (about 2.7 miles)
Northeast-Southwest:	4 kilometers (about 2.4 miles)
Width of both runways:	approximately 300 meters (975 feet)

Note: AAF Aeronautical Chart #262 (1: 1,000,000) shows the Koksharovka field as a landing field with limited or no facilities, or one on which logistic information is unavailable, as of February 1945. The above figures are considered exaggerated.)

2. There are two hangars; one of them is underground adjacent to the field, and the other is built in one of the mountains surrounding the field. The underground hangar contained twenty-four bombers, some of which were believed to be German Heinkels, and twenty-one single-seater fighters. The other hangar housed seven-teen of the same type single-seater fighters.

Note: It is doubtful that the underground hangar is large enough to contain twenty-four bombers and twenty-one fighters.)
