- The best customers the Estonian markets have are residents of Leningrad who come to Talliam regularly to do their shopping. Bread bought in Talliam for fifteen rubles per kilogram sells in Leningrad for 120 rubles.
- 2. The official price of a newspaper is only twenty kopecks, but editions are limited and a newspaper brings one or two rubles on the black market because it is used as cigarette paper.
- Chocolate is smuggled from Finland to Estonia. The Finns import it from Sweden.
- The average income of a worker is 250 to 350 rubles a month.
