ORIGIN

1. Dr. Constantin Parhon, noted Rumanian neuro-psychiatrist and adversity professor, was born on 15 October 1874 in Campulung, Muscel.

- 2. During the Legionnaire regime and later under the Antonescu or statorship, he was present at a series of meetings with Professor D. Bagdazar, C. Marinescu, and others, in which dictatorial methods were condemned from a hu smitarian rather than a political point of view. Probably as a result of his attitude, Parhon was relieved of his teaching duties and made an honorary prof or at the Bucharest Faculty of Medicine in March 1942 because of "advanced age". The part he played in protesting the persecution of numerous Jewi a doctors under the racial laws also contributed to his being pensioned by the intonescu regime. Nevertheless he continued to practice medicine at the Central Aspital even after he was pensioned, making no secret of his hostility to the relime. In June 1944 he signed the first manifest against the Antonescu Gover ment, together with sixty-three other University professors.
- 3. Following the fall of the Antonescu regime on 23 August 1944, Ourhon became interested in the establishment of closer relations between Russinia and the Soviet Union. In November 1944 he became president of ARLUS, or association for promoting such a relationship, and has been particularly wive in urging closer scientific and cultural ties with Russia. In October 5 he visited the Soviet Union and on his return wrote a series of descriptive anticles.
- 4. Parhon was elected deputy for Maramures County on the Communial Party ticket in November 1946 and is considered one of the strongest suppor are of the present regime.
