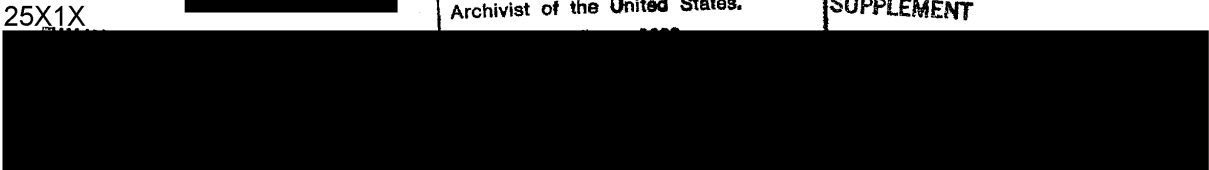

SOURCE

1. Wildpark (Z53), [Redacted], contained two artillery guns, one with twelve 210 mm long-barreled guns, the other with twelve 150 mm long-barreled guns.

2. The guns were placed along the road to Geltow (Z43) at intervals of approximately ten meters, with a larger interval between detachments. Most of the barrels were pointed to the sky; some had muzzle covers and some were being cleaned. [Redacted]

4. There were two road blocks on the road between Bahnhof Wildpark and Wildpark West, each manned by one sentry. Other single guards were seen at the entrance to the Nordtor woods, at the tank truck parking space, and at the sentry posts of the two artillery units. All guards were armed with automatic pistols. Two tree observation posts opposite the guns were not manned.

5. Troops in the area were aged 19 to 25. Few of them wore decorations. They apparently were new to the post.

6. Approximately 600 meters north of Kuhfort, source observed a heavy field cable running north to south in the direction of the artillery regiment.

Comment: "Regiment" is source's sole reference to the size of these units.
