1. Prisoner of War and other camps in Russia:

Camp No.	Location, description
II	: Leningrad; composed of approximately 8,000 men.
24/1	: Mansherlinki (in the Urals, beyond Chelyabinsk). There are allegedly ten to twelve camps in Chelyabinsk, with an average of 800 men each. A camp for SS men and Russian prisoners is located near-by.
33/Mo	: Located along the Moscow-Minsk road, approximately 150 kms. from Minsk; composed of about 3,000 officers and enlisted men.
35	: Lebedyan (53°03'N; 39°08'E; 350 kms. south of Moscow). In 1945, there were ten sub-camps of Camp 35; these were later transferred farther east. A camp in Podolsk (near Moscow) also belonged to the group.
99/17	: Karaganda (49°30'N; 73°30'E), Kazakstan. [Redacted] Camp 99/7 is located in Karaganda.)
139/9	: Sverdlovsk; composed of approximately 12,000 men.
144/7	: Prianka, Voroshilovgrad area.
165	: Located in a woods, approximately 300 kms. east of Moscow, in the direction of Gorki. The camp houses about 4,000 enlisted men and 800 - 1,000 officers. (According to [Redacted] Camp 165 is located in Vyazniki.)
265	: Tarnopol; it is connected with several sub-camps. (Camp 265 is located at Volk, [Redacted])
270/5	: So-called "Sandlager", located approximately 60 kms. from Novgorod. It is a convalescent center.
314	: Sverdlovsk; sub-camps 314/1 to 314/9 are located near-by. There is also a civilian labor camp for women from East Prussia near Sverdlovsk, composed of 500 - 1400 internees.
346	: Stalingrad; connected with sixteen to eighteen other camps located outside the city.
375	: Moscow; composed of 25,000 to 35,000 men.
444	: Kharkov; composed of about 6,000 persons. There are fifteen sub-camps located near-by, of 2,000 to 4,000 prisoners each.

525/2 to 525/23: Located near Stalinok. There is an approximate total of 15,000 men in the group, including

- Camp 525/4: "Schachtlager", located on outskirts of Stalinok; was accommodating over 1,000 German prisoners at the end of September 1946.
- Camp 525/6: Located in a valley of the Ob river, near Stalinok.
- Camp 525/9: Located in Baidayevka, 20 kms, east of Stalinok; composed of approximately 700 Germans, in July 1946.

- 526/34 : St. Broshe, 120 kms. from Stalinok; 15,000 German prisoners were in the camp at the beginning of 1947.
- 565 : Moscow. All camps located in Moscow allegedly carry this number.
- SA 127 : Located along the Ladoga Lake, near Swanka (sic, unlocated on map).
- K 619/2 : Near Kurak; composed of approximately 8,000 PWs.
- 1205 : Civilian labor camp, located in Kadievka (48°28'N; 38°31'E), near Voroshilovgrad. It is connected with a camp in Shudina and a camp in Yeromina, each composed of approximately 500 Germans and Volksdeutsche from Hungary and Romania. Women are included in the group. Four PW camps, located near, are also included.
- 1224 : Civilian camp, located in Distribetes, near Kadievka.
- 7212 : Segezha, Karelia; composed of 14,000 PWs, including 2,000 Hungarians and 700 Austrians.
- 7362 : Stalingrad; accommodates approximately 2,000 men.
- 2989 : Hospital, located near a PW camp in Vladimir (56°8'N; 40°22'E). (Hospital 2989 is located at Kamashkovo, )

2. There is a camp in Asbest (57°2'N; 61°30'E), near Sverdlovsk, composed of approximately 15,000 prisoners.
3. More than 1,000 men and boys from East and West Prussia are housed in a camp located about 1,000 kms. from Arkhangelak, in the Kotlas (61°15'N; 46°45'E) area.
4. There are camps near Nalchik (43°32'N; 43°35'E) in the Caucasus, each housing 100 to 200 men.
5. Former Nazi party members are among the internees at a camp in Kazakstan, near Karaganda.
6. There are approximately 2,000 prisoners in a camp located 20 kms. southeast of Minsk.
7. In January 1947, 8,000 to 10,000 prisoners were housed in a camp located near Petropavlovsk.
8. A camp in Tagil, connected with six sub-camps, houses up to 5,000 men.
9. At Uss, located in the Urals 120 kms. south-southwest of Sverdlovsk, there is a penal camp for men and women, composed of approximately 3,000 persons.
10. There are about 4,000 officers and enlisted men in a camp located about fifteen kms. east of Zaporozh'e (47°45'N; 35°11'E). Romanians and Bulgarians are included in the group.
