- The Central Administration for Fuel and Power (DZVB) published officially on 8 May 1947 the percentages by which the production target figures in the brown coal industry were fulfilled in March and April 1947. According to this report the following was achieved:

	Brown Coal		Briquettes

Total for Eastern Zone	98.6%	101.9%	96.8%	106.5%

*Comment:* Comparison with the production of the 3rd quarter of 1946, shows how deceptive these percentages are. The following were the target figures for the 3rd Quarter 1946 and the 2nd quarter 1947:

The actual production of brown coal during the 3rd quarter 1946 was 28,500,000 tons. This means that the target figures for the 2nd Quarter are actually 14.7% below the production of the 3rd Quarter 1946. As regards briquettes, the percentage is 8.2%.

- The percentage of participation of SAGs in the brown coal industry is as follows:

Brown Coal 32.3% - 7,800,000 tons  
 Briquettes 38.7% - 2,100,000 tons
