- 1. During the past month there allegedly has been a pronounced resentment within the armed forces in Venezuela toward the Accion Democratica Party. Precautions have been taken by members of the Army and National Guard to preserve their prestige and to strengthen their position in case ocion Democratica endeavors to remove them. The Army and National Guard are positivally dissatisfied with the domination of the Constituent Assembly by the Party and with its approval of accounts of various ministries in which there have been allegations of fraud and graft. Members of the Army, particularly, feel this situation could be corrected, although not without dissension within the Party ranks, if Romulo Gallegos, official Accion Democratica candidate, is elected to the presidency.
- 2. Reports of graft by Romulo Betancourt, amounting to approximately 5,000,000 bolivares, have been received. This amount allege by has been transferred to New York through an agent of Betancourt. Other Action Democratica government officials have been accused of graft amounting to ame 20,000,000 bolivares from the Ministry of Finance through the collection of import duties at the port of La Guaira. Information has also been received concerning graft in the amount of 11,000,000 bolivares in the Linea Aeropostal Venezolana (LAV), which is government—cwned and controlled. It is reported that practically no records of accounts are kept by LAV.
- 3. Lt. Colonel Carlos Delgado Chalbaud, Minister of Defense, and Lt. Colonel Mario Vargas, Minister of Interior and a commanding officer in the National Guard, have stated their lack of concern in the immediate future over any civilian uprising. However, they are extremely concerned a but what might happen upon the closing of the National Constituent Assembly. In the event that this body terminates its work without making provisions for changes in the decisions of the Jurado de Responsibilidad Civil y Administrativa with regard to the financial assets of former government officials in the old Genez, Lopez Contreras, and Medina Angarita regimes, there is apt to be serious disagreement among the leaders of Accion Democratica. It has been stated that Dr. Carlos Morales, Minister of Foreign Relations, and Andres Eloy Blasco, President of Accion Democratica and President of the National Constituent Assembly as well, will resign from the Party if these revisions are not mode.
