1. On 6 September all workers at three tobacco factories at Plovdiv came out on strike as a protest against the small food rations. The militia arrived, forced the men back into the factory, locked them in, and remained on guard.
2. On 7 September the militia allowed each man to be supplied with one kilo of bread, two kilos of cooked macaroni and one kilo of cooked potatoes by the families, but would not allow any one to go out of the building.
3. On the morning of 8 September the strikers were still refusing to work and were being confined.
