

- i. The IL-8 is a two-passenger Soviet aircraft plane which was converted from the IL-2. The IL-8 has a single 3000 horsepower water-cooled engine and attains a maximum speed of 338 miles per hour. The armament consists of one 37 mm machine cannon; two 20 mm machine cannon; and five 13 mm machine guns. The following sketch, showing the placement of this armament, is based on close observation of the IL-8 [REDACTED] in Changchun in December 1945.



2. The IL-12 is a Soviet transport plane with twin engines. The cruising speed is between 188 and 200 miles per hour. The cargo capacity is between 6160 and 6600 pounds. The plane is believed to have been tested in January 1947 and is now being used to supply Soviet forces in Siberia.
