Note: Information presented below is possible evidence that the Soviet Military Forces on the Kuantung Peninsula have been increased.)



- 1. Of the 60,000 Soviet troops now on the Kuantung Peninsula, 30,000 are stationed in and near Shihho (121-52, 39-21), along the 39-20 parallel; 20,000 are in and around Port Arthur; and 10,000 are stationed in various posts along the coast-line and in the interior.

Note: The location and numbers of Soviet troops mentioned in the remainder of this report tend to support the statement above.)

- 2. In the Sanchienpao (121-16, 38-54) area there are 8,000 Soviet marines and 2,500 air corps personnel, including troops attached to the airforce (see paragraph 29).
- 3. There are 230 Soviet troops guarding Peihaikou (北海口/?Peihaitun, 121-11, 38-56, on the western shore of Tachackou Bay/121-12, 38-57).
- 4. In the Shuichihying (121-14, 38-51) area there are 5,000 Soviet troops billeted in the Palichuang (八里庄) barracks, east of Shuichihying. The barracks are guarded by thirty machine and thirty carriage-mounted guns. The barracks on the southern side of Chikvanshan (121-14, 38-47) are surrounded by twenty anti-aircraft guns and an electrically-charged wire fence.
- 5. There are 400 Soviet troops in the southern end of Paiyanshan (121-17, 38-49) equipped with twenty anti-aircraft guns.
- 6. There are 3,000 Soviet troops stationed in Taiyangkou (太陽溝/?Taiyangkou, 121-43, 39-14).
- 7. Along the beach south of Lungwangtung (?Falungwangtangtung, 121-23, 38-50) there are 700 Soviet troops equipped with five anti-aircraft guns.

8. There are 8,000 Soviet troops in Shih'ao and in the area of Tungshan'ao (東山坳) ?Tungshanhou, (121-47, 39-16). One hundred mountain and carriage-mounted guns have been placed on the hill west of Hsi Chiang (下港) ?Hsi Chiangchiakou, (121-57, 39-10). Soviet troops are using the former Japanese barracks there.

9. As of 16 September 1947 there were six Soviet transports in Dairen Harbor. Two were 8,000 ton transports. The other four were smaller.

10. Over 4,000 well armed Japanese and Korean troops debarked in Dairen Harbor (?from the six ships mentioned in paragraph 9) on 16 September. They were met by forty trucks which took them to Tsuchaitun (突塞屯), [redacted] northwest of Dairen. 25X1

11. A barrier ten feet deep and eight feet wide has been constructed by the Soviet authorities along the seacoast from Hsiaopingtaotun (121-29, 38-50) to Hsingkepu (121-34, 38-53). Soviet guards are stationed along the barrier.

Note: [redacted] on 8 February 1947 the Soviet authorities began mobilizing 3,400 laborers to erect defenses along the coast from Hsiaopingtaotun to Tientaishan (?).

12. Over 1,200 Soviet soldiers were recently sent from Port Arthur to Hsiaocheshantun (121-53, 39-18).

13. On 19 November a Soviet Transportation Unit left Shihchiakou (121-33, 38-56) for Port Arthur. Approximately 1,200 Soviet Troops and over 400 vehicles still remain in Shihchiakou.

14. On 9 November 1947 approximately 700 Soviet infantry troops left the Tashong (大聖), Ch'angan (常安) and Chaoming (照明) sections of the P'ien-shent'ing (天神町) District of Dairen for Chinchou (121-43, 39-07).

15. A large exchange of Soviet troops in the Port Arthur area has been made. Soviet troops from Port Arthur have left for Chita (113-30, 52-01), Siberia. Soviet troops have arrived at Port Arthur from Hailan'ao (海蘭泡) (Chinese name for Blagoveshchensk /127-30, 50-16), USSR.

16. Approximately 2,600 Soviet infantry troops stationed in Yangshukou (121-12, 38-48) District of Port Arthur left Port Arthur on two trains, between 10:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. on 1 November 1947. It is rumored that their destination is Chinchou.

17. During the first part of August 30,000 Soviet marines were transferred to the Kuantung Peninsula from North Korea. 15,000 of the marines are stationed at Yuantao (圓島 (?)) (see paragraph 2).

18. There are approximately 260 Soviet artillery troops with thirty-two artillery pieces (size unstated) stationed at Takouching (121-08, 38-52). On 8 November 1947,

ninety-four Soviet engineer troops arrived at Takouching from Yangtounatun (121-07, 38-50). The troops are engaged in repair work. Twenty-six small boats and 340 coolies have been hired. The coolies are employed in carrying sand and are paid two catties of corn or flour per day. The boats are paid 5,000 yuan (? Soviet Army occupation currency) per day.

19. There are between 4,500 and 4,600 Soviet infantry troops in the Shuangtao Bay Area, in and around Pantai (121-10, 38-54). The troops arrived in this area from the USSR on 17 and 18 October 1947 (see paragraph 15).
 20. On 16 November 1947, 3,200 Soviet infantry troops debarked from ships at the Port Arthur East Harbor and proceeded immediately to Liushufang (121-19, 38-54), where they are now stationed (see paragraphs 15 and 19). The 600 Soviet infantry troops which had been stationed in Liushufang departed for Dairen on 10 November 1947.
 21. There are approximately 2,300 Soviet artillery troops in Wangchiatientszu (121-09, 38-50). They are equipped with twenty-one extra-heavy artillery pieces and forty-two heavy artillery pieces. All artillery pieces are drawn by vehicles.
 22. The Soviet artillery regiment originally stationed southwest of Chouchiatun (121-23, 38-55, 121-35, 38-58 or 121-42, 39-07 undetermined) moved into a newly constructed barracks at Yutashan (121-23, 39-02) on 7 November 1947. There are 1,600 troops in this regiment.
 23. Approximately 1,540 Soviet infantry troops landed at the Port Arthur West Harbor on 14 November 1947 (see paragraphs 15, 19 and 20). These troops are now stationed at the Kuochiakou (121-20, 38-50) Arsenal which is east of Hsiaokushan (121-18, 38-50).
 24. On 6 November 1947, 600 Soviet infantry troops stationed at Hsiaopanchiatun (121-10, 38-52) boarded a special train of seven cars for Dairen.
 25. There are approximately 600 Soviet artillery troops at Tuanshanzhu (121-17, 38-52), south of the Lungtou (121-18, 38-52) Railroad Station. They are equipped with thirty-five artillery pieces.
 26. There are approximately 430 Soviet transportation troops at Wangchiatun (probably 121-53, 39-08), near Panlungshan (盤龍山 / Panlashan, 121-47, 39-12). There are ten heavy cargo trucks and 206 other vehicles attached to this unit.
 27. On 6 October 1947, 210 of the 450 Soviet engineer troops at Machiakou (122-06, 39-12) also departed for Dairen.
 28. There is a mixed Soviet unit consisting of 16 Chinese, 19 Japanese and 31 Soviets at Shihpankou (121-45, 39-07). The Soviet members of this unit speak excellent Chinese. 25X1X

29. There are 260 Soviet Air Corps personnel billeted in the Huangchintai Branch Hotel (黃金台別墅). The main Hotel is in the Shingyeht'ing (Aobacho / 青葉町) District of Port Arthur. The Air Corps personnel billeted in the Branch Hotel are stationed at the Sanchienpao (121-16, 38-54) Airfield.
 30. There are sixty-one Soviet Air Corps personnel billeted in the Fushou Hotel (福壽). The Fushou Hotel is in the Ch'aojiht'ing (Asahicho / 朝日町) District of Port Arthur.

31. There are thirty-nine Soviet Air Corps personnel billeted in the Korean Pao Lai Hotel (寶萊). The Pao Lai Hotel is in the Naimut'ing (Nogicho / 乃木町) District of Port Arthur.

32. Flat cars loaded with tanks are located every 3.3 railway miles between Dairen and Port Arthur (? on a side track).

33. On 2 December 1947 approximately 1,430 Soviet artillery troops left Niuchiaoshan (牛角山, [redacted] eight kilometers north of Chinchou) for Tangchiafang (122-10, 39-24). This unit of artillery troops is equipped with thirty-six 76 mm field pieces, each of which is drawn by vehicles.

34. Nine American-made amphibious vehicles entered Dairen from Port Arthur on 4 December 1947. In each vehicle were fifteen soldiers. Officers in the vehicles carried maps.

35. The following is Soviet military information regarding the Hsiachiatun (121-29, 39-02) area:

- (1) The area between the railroad and the beach is a Soviet curfew area. Barriers have been erected one 1 1/2 east and west of the Railroad Station, before passing which travelers must present permits and submit to a search. Two Soviet regiments are stationed here, equipped with five tanks, twenty trucks and ten jeeps.
