- The guerrillas on Crete are being supplied through three small fast ships, of about 10-15 tons each, on the eastern and southern shores of the island.
- 2. These ships take on cargoes of raisins in order to have "clean" shipping papers, and go to Cyprus where they unload the raisins and take on German weapons. These weapons came from Rhodes, which was occupied by the Gormans.
- 5. After the weapons have been put on board, the ships sail to Crete and unload at different deserted shores; afterwards they report at the harbors with their shipping papers (particularly at Nisaki, where the lepers are).
