2. Source stated that the following arms are the most common in the Bulgarian Army:

- a. Soviet long range guns equipped with optical sights. Their range is 2,000 meters and they take a five bullet clip.
- b. Sajser (heavy machine gun) of Soviet make, 9 mm. loading 72 bullets. Heavy and awkward equipment.
- c. Light machine gun (automatic) with 32 bullets of 9 mm. caliber.
- d. Staljinac, very light machine gun, takes 74 bullets.
- e. Zbrojovka of Czech make, a small carbine which takes a five bullet clip and has a range of 1,700 meters.
- f. Svaralose, heavy machine gun of German make.
- g. Maksim, heavy machine gun of Soviet make (German design).
- h. M.G. light machine gun of German make, takes 50 bullets.
