1. Sir G.S. Bajpai, of the Ministry of External Affairs, stated in an off-the-record interview that India is not now giving any aid to Indonesia, but that if the Security Council ignores Asian Conference demands, "obviously we will have to do something; we cannot be made international fools of."
2. The following rumor is current among Congress Party-controlled journalists in New Delhi:
