SUPPLEMENT TO REPORT NO.

1. On 10 January 1949 Ahmad As'ad, llimister of Public Norks and a deputy for South Lebanon, discussed with President Khuri an idea, backed by As'ad, to have a large number of deputies sign an appeal to the President requesting the dissolution of the Chamber of Deputies, in view of the unsavory reputation that the Chamber has tad "since 25 lky 1947." Source states that As'ad pointed out to the President that the reason he favors dissolution of the Chamber is because he does not cant it said that he became a number of the Chamber by fraudulent means, expecially as he had represented South Lebanon in all the Chambers preceding the present one. Source feels that President Khuri favors As'ad's plan, which is also satisfactory to opposition elements, northindarly as it originated with the deputies and not with the President.


