

- lo Major Oscar Oscrio, leading member of the Salvadoran governing junta, has set up a secret "Political Bureau" whose purpose is to organize a counteroffensive of anti-leftist forces in opposition to the Communist Party, the Partido de Orientacion Lemocratica (POD) and the Part.do Accion lienovadora (PAR). The Political Bureau consists of the following men: Major Jose Alberto Funes, Lt. Col. Adan Parada, Lt. Col. Miguel Parais, Major Arnoldo Rodezno, Major hafael Carranza Amaya, and Major Tareel Espinoza. Not even the members of the Salvadoran governing junta, including borio's military colleague, Major Oscar Bolanos, know of the existence of the Political Bureau.
- 2. The first report of the Bureau is entitled "Report on the Activities of the Political Bureau (Confidential for Major Osorio)." It commences with the statement that the Bureau was created to perform two services necessary to the conquest of political rositions in the forthcoming Constituent Assembly and presidential elections. These services are the Information Service and Organization Service. The report is divided into two sections dealing with the two services.
- 3. The Information Service is recruiting agents to report in the activities of the following organizations:
 - PAR, former party of Opl. Jose Ascencio Menendez, which has Guatemalan connections through the Comite Salvadoren Liberacion Nacional (CSLN).
 - b) POD, run by left.st students.
 - Comite de Organizacion Obrera (CRO), which plans to organize all
 - The Communist Party, which, according to the report, was successfully infiltrated key positions in the government, and which aims to influence the forthcoming elections by gaining Army and labor support.

4. The Information Service reported that political parties of former presidential candidates are also disposed to join in the anti-leftist bloc or coalition. These parties and their former candidates include:

Partido Nacional Democrata -- Professor Jose Andres Orantes

Partido Social Democrata-Osmin Aguirre

Partido Union Nacional-Espinola Castro

Partido Fraternal Progresista-General Claremount

Partido Lemocrata Republicano-General Pena Trejo

Orantes has offered his party's unconditional cooperation, and the other parties go along with Political Bureau objectives, though the candidates themselves, having already been eliminated, did not personally endorse the affiliation.

- The Information Service report concluded with a statement that it recognized that Mexican and Guatemelan elements were supporting the leftist infiltration of the Salvadoran government. It added that Major Humberto Villelta's influence with the governing junta, prior to his removal by Osorio, had involved El Salvador with the old pattern of conspiracies carried on by the CSLN, which organization was still connected with the young militarists in the government. The report stated the Information Service's specific mission to be the compiling of data to neutralize press and other propaganda against the governing junta. The data would also serve as organization guide for the coalition forces.
- 6. The second arm of the Political Bureau, the Service of Organization, Press and Propaganda, stated as its:objectives the formation and utilization of the following combination of parties to support Major Osorio:
 - a) The Partido Democrata Progresista (PDP) based on
 - a coslition of former political parties (as described in paragraph 4 above)
 - 2) Capital
 - 3) Clergy
 - 4) The conservative element of the people
 - b) The Partido Revolucionarie Salvadoreno (PRS) based on
 - 1) The Army
 - 2) Labor (already partially organized)
- 7. These two parties would be organized independently but would be secretly synchronized by a Central Directive Board which would force their public unification when elections for the Constituent Assembly are called. The basic political party would be the PDP, while the PRS would aim its program at the laboring class in general, and would combat the leftists by their own revolutionary methods such as the formation of factions within labor unions.
