The most active smuggling bases in Taiwan are as follows:

In the vicinity of Maolin (Morin) village near Shihmen (Sekimon)(121-33, 25-17)

Nanao (Nano)(121-48, 24-28) and Tungao (Too)(121-49, 24-31) area.

Taan (Taian)(120-37, 24-21) and Wuhsi (Gosei)(121-49, 24-31) area.

Putai (Hotei)(120-10, 23-23) area.

Tungchiang (Toko)(120-27, 22-28) area.

Hungmaochiang (Komoko)(120-19, 22-33) area.

b. Other Taiwan smuggling bases are:

Suangch'i (Sokei)(121-34, 25-07) area near Keelung (Kiirun).

Szuchieh (Shiketsu)(121-45, 24-47) area.

Chiuchiang (Kyuko)(莲龙), Kangshan (Okayama)(120-17, 22-48) District, Kaohsiung (Takao)(120-17, 22-38) Province.

K'angliang (Koryo)(康梁) and Fuhsing (Fukko)(復興) areas in Taitung (Taito)(121-09, 22-45) District, Taitung Province.

Hualienchiang (Karenko)(121-36, 23-58) area.

- Vessels used for illicit trade are 10- to 30-ton sailboats (with motors) and motorboats with engines of 20 to 50 horsepower.
- 3. Hong Kong, Hainan Island, Foochow (China), Malaya, Okinawa and Japan are the main destinations of the Taiwan smugglers. The Okinawa and Ryukoku (大阪) and the Tanshui (Tansui)(121-25, 25-11) and Fengshan (Hozan)(120-23, 22-38) areas in Taiwan. Although figures are not available, it is believed a considerable amount of goods is smuggled.

- 4. Another smuggling route between Japan and Taiwan has a relay base in the Ryukyu Islands, although some smugglers deal directly with Japan from Suao (Suo)(121-51, 24-36), Taiwan, using motorboats.
- 5. Kobe, Nagasaki, Hirado (十分) and Fukuoka (石面) are the Japanese bases for smuggling goods to and from Okinawa, Taiwan, Malaya and Hong Kong. The Sannomiya Choko (三 / 字)(長 江) Industrial Co., Ltd., in the Kobe and Ikida (生日) areas of Japan, engages in illicit trade on an exceedingly large scale in collaboration with the Ch'angchiang (Choko)(長江石)) Co. 3rd Street, Penting (本日), Taipei City, Taiwan which in turn has close relations with cooperative societies in the various villages and districts.
- 6. There is much illegal fishing and smuggling of goods done by the fishing boats, who use bases on Taiwan similar (sic) to the smugglers' bases.
- 7. a. Goods smuggled out of Taiwan are as follows:

Rice Matches
Sugar Hemp
Peanut oil Tobacco
Rubber* Quinine

b. Goods smuggled into Taiwan are:

Cotton fabrics Nedicines Rubber*

8. In an effort to put an end to illicit trade, a patrol station has been established and a search unit stationed in Suao to investigate smuggling activities. After the establishment of the patrol station a census was taken in areas believed to contain smugglers' bases, and all rice-hoarders were arrested. This step was a severe blow to the smugglers, who are said to be devising new ways of hoarding commodities. The patrol station has a thorough organization and has accomplished much in preventing illicit trade. However, smuggling might increase in the future, no matter how strictly curbed, because it is impossible to stamp it out as long as the economic problems of the small merchants are not solved and the living standards of the Taiwanese are not improved.
